A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE RESEARCH, WRITING AND PRINTING OF A SURVEY ON HOMER'S HISTORIC BUILDINGS, BY THE HOMER SOCIETY OF NATURAL HISTORY AND THE CITY OF HOMER

WHEREAS, the City of Homer, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and the Homer Society of Natural History, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Society", have a common interest in documenting and preserving history in order to:

- a) increase and preserve our knowledge of Homer's past for residents and visitors,
- b) develop public awareness, appreciation and pride for Homer's diverse heritage as reflected in the buildings around us,
- c) use the information to help Homer's economic development by promoting civic pride and tourist interest in our community,
- d) help guide the local government in land use planning by evaluating these historic resources and their eligibility for State and Federal preservation and/or loan programs; and,

WHEREAS, the City and the Society share a common responsibility to help promote historic preservation; and,


WHEREAS, the City is presently undergoing continuing and rapid change which has the potential to impact the historic buildings and their sites; and,


