RESOLUTION 85-48

**A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR AN ELECTION FOR
CONTINUATION OF A SIX MILL PROPERTY TAX
LIMITATION AND TWO PERCENT SALES TAX.**

WHEREAS, April 24, 1984, at a special municipal election, voters approved a proposition authorizing a six mill property tax limitation with an increased two percent sales tax levy;

WHEREAS, the City of Homer is desirous of maintaining a six mill or less tax levy limit;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City of Homer hereby calls for a referendum vote at the Regular Municipal Election of October 1, 1985 proposing to continue the authority granted by the Homer voters at a special election April 24, 1984;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ballot proposition for October 1, 1985 will read as follows:

"Shall the City of Homer by enactment of an ordinance so providing continue to set the property tax mill levy at an annual rate of six mill or less through levy of a two percent sales tax on all sales, rents and services within the City, except as the same may be otherwise exempted by law. The revenues from the sales tax shall be placed in the General Fund. Voter authorization for the two percent sales tax shall only remain in effect for those years that the City Council sets the property mill levy at six mill or less. Should the proposition be disapproved by the voters at this election, the existing sales tax will continue in full force and effect until June 30, 1986 after which it shall cease to be levied".
