RESOLUTION 85-72

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR CONTINUATION OF A SIX MILL  
PROPERTY TAX LIMITATION AND TWO PERCENT SALES TAX.

WHEREAS, the demand for services which benefit both the citizens of Homer and those who live within the surrounding area has expanded dramatically in the past several years; and

WHEREAS, a tax on the sales, rents and services provided within the City is the fairest and most equitable method of taxation in that it affects all users of municipal services whether or not they are property owners within the City; and

WHEREAS, on April 24, 1984 at a special municipal election, voters approved a proposition authorizing a six mill property tax limitation with a two percent sales tax levy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Homer is desirous of maintaining a six mill or less tax levy limit on property within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Common Council of the City of Homer hereby supports the continuation of a six mill or less property tax limit and the continuation of the two percent sales tax levy.
