RESOLUTION 87-3

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HOMER SUPPORTING DEVELOPMENT
OF THE BYPASS PARK AND SALE OF THE BYPASS GREENBELT.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Land and Water Conservation Fund, federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in the financing of the cost of land for parks; and

WHEREAS, several parcels known as the Bypass Greenbelt were acquired with federal funds for outdoor recreation and open space in perpetuity; and

WHEREAS, development pressures surrounding the parcel have reduced the outdoor recreational value of the intended park; and


WHEREAS, the City is attempting to develop the nearby Homer Bypass Park as a "wayside" park including a recreational vehicle disposal station as a convenient facility to visitors and travelers coming to Homer; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Commission at their regular meeting held December 18, 1986 unanimously requested the City Council to obtain the right to sell the Bypass Greenbelt property and apply the monies toward the development of the Bypass Park as a "wayside" park.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Homer that the City Manager is hereby authorized to take appropriate steps to obtain necessary approval to sell property acquired as the Bypass Greenbelt with funding under the Land and Water Conservation Fund and apply such proceeds toward the completion of the Bypass Park as a viable tourist "wayside" park with adequate facilities for visitors and travelers.
