A RESOLUTION of the City Council of the City of Homer, Alaska, providing for an assurance to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation that revenues of the City's sewer system will be available for paying the obligations of the City pursuant to the Loan Agreement authorized by Resolution No. 89-76 of the City Council, which obligations are to be evidenced by the issuance of a junior lien sewer revenue bond in the principal amount of not to exceed \$4,750,000.

WHEREAS, on August 28, 1989 the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Homer, Alaska (the "City") passed and approved Resolution No. 89-76 (the "Resolution") authorizing a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") between the City and the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (the "Department") under the Alaska Clean Water Fund and authorizing the issuance and sale of the City's Junior Lien Sewer Revenue Bond, 1989 in an amount not to exceed \$4,750,000 (the "Bond") to evidence the City's obligation to the Department under the Loan Agreement; and

WHEREAS, revenues of the City sewer system pledged to repay the Bond are encumbered by the senior lien of certain Parity Bonds, as defined in the Resolution, and therefore Section 4.4 of the Loan Agreement requires the City to furnish legal assurance that the excess of such prior encumbered revenues of System are legally available for pledging to the Department; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to comply with the Loan Agreement and to provide such legal assurance to the Department;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOMER, ALASKA, as follows:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in this resolution, capitalized terms shall have the meanings set forth in Resolution No. 89-76 of the City (the "Resolution").

Section 2. Future Parity Bonds. So long as the Bond is outstanding, the City shall not issue any Parity Bonds or junior lien revenue bonds on a parity with the Bond without the written consent of the owner of the Bond, which consent shall not be unreasonably denied based on the City's showing of its ability to make payments on the Bond.

Section 3. Further Actions. The proper officials of the City are authorized and directed to execute all documents and to do everything necessary for the execution and delivery of the Loan Agreement and the preparation and delivery of the Bond in accordance with the Resolution and this resolution.

Section 4. Ratification. All actions and proceedings heretofore taken by the officers, agents, attorneys and employees of the City in connection with the negotiation of the Loan Agreement and the issuance of the Bond are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 5. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.
