A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL
REQUESTING SUPPORT BY THE ALASKAN DELEGATION
FOR FUNDING OF THE ALASKA MARITIME VISITORS
FACILITY IN HOMER, ALASKA.

WHEREAS, a duly published hearing was held on October
23, 1989 in order to obtain public comments on recommended fiscal
year 1989-94 Capital Improvement Projects and priorities, and

WHEREAS, an Alaska Maritime Visitors Facility would
include an aquarium as part of interpretive center thereby
creating a much needed tourist attraction, and


WHEREAS, the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Agency has been
exploring the feasibility of a center which would provide
educational facilities for the U.S. Fish & Wildlife, Alaska Fish
& Game, University of Alaska, other local agencies within the
City of Homer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of
the City of Homer, Alaska that the Alaska Maritime Visitors
Facility is a community priority requiring federal support for
the initial feasibility study in the amount of \$300,000.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is hereby
instructed to advise the Alaskan Delegation of the City Council
determination and to respectfully urge the funding of the Alaska
Maritime Visitors Facility in Homer, Alaska.
