1 CITY OF HOMER 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 Novak/Roberts 4 ORDINANCE 09-02 5 6 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING HCC 9.16.010 AND HCC 7 9.16.100 TO PROVIDE FOR THE LEVY OF A SALES TAX ON 8 SALES OF NONPREPARED FOOD ITEMS IN THE CITY OF 9 HOMER AT A RATE OF 3.0% DURING THE PERIOD FROM SEPTEMBER 1ST THROUGH MAY 31ST, AND AUTHORIZING 10 THE CITY TO SUBMIT THE QUESTION OF LEVYING SUCH 11 12 SALES TAX TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY AT 13 THE OCTOBER 6, 2009 REGULAR CITY ELECTION. 14 WHEREAS, At the October 7, 2008 regular election held in the Kenai Peninsula 15 16 Borough ("Borough"), the Borough voters approved an initiative proposition exempting sales of nonprepared food items from Borough sales tax during the period from September 1st through 17 18 May 31st; and 19 20 WHEREAS, The City of Homer ("City") enacted Ordinance 08-32(S)(A-2) on December 21 8, 2008, providing for the same exemption of sales of nonprepared food items from City sales 22 tax; and 23 24 WHEREAS, The exemption of sales of nonprepared food items from City sales tax is 25 expected to have a significant impact on City revenues, and that impact will be demonstrated by 26 experience with the exemption during the first half of 2009; and 27 28 WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the City that the qualified voters of the City have 29 an opportunity at the October 6, 2009 regular City election to express their choice whether to retain the City sales tax exemption for nonprepared food items during the period from September 30 1st through May 31st, or to reinstate a City sales tax on nonprepared food items at a rate of 3.0% 31 32 during the period from September 1st through May 31st. 33 34 NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HOMER HEREBY ORDAINS: 35 36 Section 1. The City of Homer exercises the authority granted it under Kenai 37 Peninsula Borough Ordinance 2008-28 to levy and collect a sales tax on nonprepared food items 38 on a year-round basis notwithstanding Kenai Peninsula Borough Initiative Ordinance 2008-01. 39 Section 2. Homer City Code 9.16.010(a) is amended to read as follows: 40 41 9.16.010 Levied. a. A consumer's sales tax in the amount of three percent is levied by the City on all sales, rents and services within the City except as the same may 42 be otherwise exempted by law; provided that the rate of sales tax on sales of nonprepared 43 44 food items shall be 1.5% during the period from September 1 through May 31. This 45 reduced tax rate on sales of nonprepared foods items shall no longer be effective if the 46 exemption of sales of nonprepared food items from Kenai Peninsula Borough sales tax is

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47 repealed or overturned. As used in this subsection, the term "nonprepared food items" 48 shall have the meaning ascribed to that term in Chapter 5.18 of the Kenai Peninsula 49 Borough Code, as the same may be amended from time to time. 50 51 Section 3. Homer City Code 9.16.100 is amended to read as follows: 52 53 9.16.100 Exemptions. Except for sales of nonprepared food items, all sales, rents 54 and services that are exempted from sales tax under the Kenai Peninsula Borough Code 55 as amended from time to time shall be exempt from the sales tax levied by Section 56 9.16.010. 57 58 Section 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this ordinance are of a permanent and general character 59 and shall be included in the city code. 60 61 The City shall submit the following proposition to the qualified voters of Section 5. the City at the October 6, 2009, regular City election. The proposition must receive an 62 63 affirmative vote from a majority of the qualified voters voting on the question to be approved. 64 PROPOSITION NO. 65 SALES TAX ON NONPREPARED FOODS 66 67 Shall the City of Homer levy a sales tax on sales of nonprepared food 68 items at a rate of 3.0%, consisting of 0.75% to fund water and sewer systems (HAWSP), 0.75% to fund construction of roads and trails (HART), and 1.5% for 69 70 the general fund during the period from September 1st through May 31st? 71 72 Section 6. The proposition shall be printed on paper ballots and machine ballots, and the following words shall be added as appropriate next to an oval provided for marking the ballot 73 74 for voting by hand or machine: 75 76 PROPOSITION NO. 77 78 0 Yes 79 0 No 80 81 Section 7. Sections 1 through 4 of this ordinance shall become effective on January 82 1, 2010, but only if the proposition described in Section 5 is approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the proposition at the October 6, 2009, regular City election.
