ORDINANCE 79-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4-100.15, ABSENTEE
VOTING, CHAPTER 4, OF THE HOMER CITY CODE

WHEREAS, certain sections of the Homer City Code regarding
absentee voting do not coincide with the Alaska Statutes, and

WHEREAS, those sections of the Homer City Code cannot be
practically applied,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HOMER ORDAINS:


Section 1. Section 4-100.5, Absentee Voting is hereby
amended as follows:

- (b) A qualified voter may apply for an absentee ballot,
in person, on any day after the ballots are prepared
and available, but not on election day.
- (c) A qualified voter may apply for an absentee ballot by
mail if postmarked not more than six months nor less
than 5:00 p.m. on the Friday preceding the election.
The application by letter must contain the voter's
name, a statement that he is a qualified voter of
the City of Homer, his address where the absentee
ballot is to be sent, and his local resident address.
- (d) A person may apply for an absentee ballot through a
personal representative on the date of, or not more
than 20 days before, the date of an election. The
written application must contain the voter's name,
a statement that he is a qualified voter of the City
of Homer, and his local resident address. The written
application must also be signed by the applicant and
must be accompanied by a letter from a licensed
physician or a statement signed by two qualified
voters stating that the applicant will be unable to go
to the polling place because of physical disability.
