ORDINANCE 91-6(A)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL MAKING
A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEAR
1991 TO THE PORT OF HOMER FOR CAPITAL
IMPROVEMENTS, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE
DATE.

WHEREAS, the Port & Harbor Commission met on January 16, 1991
to establish priority capital projects; and

WHEREAS, the Port & Harbor Enterprise fund, unrestricted cash
balance as of 1989 audit was \$529,852 and projected to be in excess
of \$800,000 for 1990, sufficient to cover the listed capital
projects; and

WHEREAS, the City of Homer and Homer Chamber of Commerce have
received a grant from the Department of Fish & Game in the amount
of \$10,000 to defray costs of constructing a restroom facility at
the Homer Spit Fishing Lagoon; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HOMER ORDAINS:

Section 1. The sum of \$189,927 is appropriated from the
Port/Harbor unrestricted cash balance in the amounts and for the
projects listed below:

1. Purchase of Lot 14, Plus Upgrade	105,616
2. Capping Load and Launch Ramp Road	14,138
3. Wood Grid	43,500
4. Steel Grid	8,500
5. Fishing Lagoon	<u>28,173**</u>
Sub-total	\$199,927
F & G Grant	<10,000>
TOTAL	\$ 189,927


Section 2. The appropriations made by this ordinance are for capital projects in the City of Homer's 1991 Fiscal Year.


