A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING THE PASSAGE OF SUBSTITUTE BILL #417 THROUGH THE ALASKA STATE LEGISLATURE THIS YEAR.

WHEREAS, the management and use of the Kenai River and its adjoining lands have become issues of great concern to the residents of the Kenai Peninsula; and

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough, the City of Kenai and the City of Soldotna have endorsed the Kenai River Management Plan as outlined in Senate Substitute Bill #417, which calls for a logical approach to the preservation of the River and allows for local municipalities to have the management power over the boundaries of the local municipality; and

WHEREAS, any decision reached for the management of the Kenai River will most assuredly be passed on down the Peninsula to the management of the Anchor River, the Ninilchik River, Deep Creek and the Homer Spit;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Homer City Council joins in those efforts already being performed by the Kenai Peninsula Borough, the City of Kenai and the City of Soldotna, in support of the passage of Senate Substitute Bill #417 through the Alaska State Legislature this year.
