A RESOLUTION FINDING THE NEED TO CREATE "HIRING PRACTICES COMMISSION" TO INVESTIGATE THE CITY OF HOMER'S PROCEDURE OF HIRING EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, for years there have been numerous allegations of discriminatory hiring practices by the City of Homer, and

WHEREAS, the worst of these allegations has been characterized as hiring the "Best Friend" instead of the "Best Person", and

WHEREAS, if true, such allegations are anathema to the administration of an upstanding, honest, forthright Alaskan City, as Homer must be, and

WHEREAS, the Homer City Council finds it necessary and advisable to investigate such allegations and thus determine the past and current status of the City of Homer's hiring practices, in order to, if necessary make corrections in such practices and/or in the personnel involved, and further to make recommendations for related future actions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Homer City Council will name a three-member HIRING PRACTICES COMMISSION, to be composed of two current council members and one former council member, in order to investigate such allegations as above and others that may arise, and to issue quarterly reports to the Council for a period of eighteen months from date of adoption hereof.
