A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF HOMER DESIGNATING THE AREA KNOWN AS
MUD BAY AT THE BASE OF THE HOMER SPIT AS A
POSSIBLE FUTURE COLLEGE SITE

WHEREAS, the residents of Homer have long planned for and desired a four year college; and

WHEREAS, institutes of higher learning promote a healthy intellectual environment for personal growth and well-being; and

WHEREAS, plans should be made to prepare for Homer's future growth and education needs; and

WHEREAS, the availability of large parcels of land in the center of Homer that are easily accessible is growing increasingly scarce; and

WHEREAS, the City of Homer has jurisdiction over the use of the area at the base of the Homer Spit, commonly known as Mud Bay; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Mud Bay could be a potential future four year college site as there is adequate space available to provide the full amenities associated with a four year college.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City of Homer hereby reserves the area at the base of the Homer Spit, commonly known as Mud Bay, for a potential future college site.
