RESOLUTION 86-65

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND WIRING COMMITTEE,  
ADVISORY TO THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL, AND PROVIDING FOR THE  
CONDITIONS AND DURATION OF THAT COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, the adoption of an ordinance requiring undergrounding of  
electrical, telecommunications and cable television lines within the city may  
be of benefit to the community; and

WHEREAS, the Homer City Council has determined that it is desirable  
to study and possibly adopt an appropriate ordinance to require undergrounding  
of overhead utility lines.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of  
Homer, Alaska that there is hereby established an Underground Wiring  
Committee, advisory to the Homer City Council, subject to the following  
conditions:

1. There shall be seven (7) members of the Committee representing  
the City Council, Homer Planning Advisory Commission, contractors, utilities,  
engineers and the general public. These members include Don Ernst, Don Ronda,  
Bruce Turkington, Tim Timmreck, Steffen Frommer, Norm Story and Dennis Colby.  
Other city staff shall only be advisory to the Committee.


2. The Committee shall be delegated the authority to review, revise  
and/or recommend appropriate ordinances necessary to implement guidelines and  
standards governing the placement of electrical, telecommunications and cable  
television lines.

3. The Committee may select necessary professional services to  
perform the work outlined by the Committee, subject to the approval of the  
Homer City Manager.


4. The duration of the Committee shall be for a period of three (3)  
months and shall expire December 8, 1986. The Committee is expected to  
present to the City Council, in final form, a recommended ordinance, governing  
the placement of electrical, telecommunications and cable television lines  
within the City of Homer.
