RESOLUTION 87-20

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH TO ENACT AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF SALES TAX COLLECTIONS THROUGH INJUNCTIVE PROCEEDINGS.

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough has the statutory legal authority for the collection of sales and use taxes within the Borough under A.S.29.45.650, and

WHEREAS, under the general penalty provision of Title 29, specifically A.S.29.25.070(b), the Borough is empowered to seek injunctive relief against persons who violate its sales tax ordinances, and

WHEREAS, failure to collect and pay sales taxes within the Borough is clearly a violation of the Borough sales tax ordinance, and

WHEREAS, enjoining the operation of a business is arguably the most effective method of enforcing the collection and payment of sales taxes, and

WHEREAS, under A.S.29.25.070(c) penalties for violation of an ordinance may be imposed only if an ordinance has been enacted setting forth the specific penalty and copies of that ordinance are made available for distribution to the public at no more than cost,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT DULY RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough are hereby requested to

submit an ordinance at the earliest possible date that provides for injunctive relief against persons and businesses that fail to collect and pay sales taxes within the Borough, as required by law, and to make copies of said ordinance available for distribution to the public at no more than cost.
