A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CITY MANAGER TO REVALUATE SOME OF THE FUNTIONS OF THE HOMER CITY GOVERNMENT.

WHEREAS, if the City Council believes that there might just be a few to many city employees, and

WHEREAS, if the City Council believes that the amount of money we are spending on the Homer City government might be too much and needs looking at, and

THEREFORE, if the above are considerations, this is a list to consider:

- 1. WAGE FREEZE
- 2. PERSONNEL FREEZE

3. CUT PORT/HARBOR EXPENSES

- 4. ELIMINATE TRANSPARENT EXCESS MANPOWER IN ALL DEPARTMENTS BY REVIEW OF EACH AND EVERY CITY POSITION, PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY.
- 5. BEGIN SHIFTING OR REPALCING FULL TIME EMPLOYEES TO PART TIME, TO MORE ADEQUATELY ADDRESS HOMER'S SEASONAL NEED.

6. REDUCE THE NUMBER OF VEHICLES.

- 7. IMMEDIATLEY CUT GENERAL EXPENSES BY 20% (less travel, ect.)
  8. CUT IN CITY SALARIES OVER \$25,000.00 IN A SLIDING SCALE UP
  TO 10 OR 15% AT THE TOP.
- 9. ELIMINATE "TRANSFERS", WHERE POSSIBLE.
- 10. ELIMINATE "CONTINGENCY" BUDGETING.
- 11. REDUCE THE WORKWEEK.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common City Council of Homer, Alaska that the City Manager review the above list and report back to the City Council upon completion.
