RESOLUTION 87-70

A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES (DOT/PF) CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1989.

WHEREAS, building and maintaining safe, efficient and reliable roads and transportation facilities is one of the most important responsibilities of state government; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT/PF) is responsible for long range statewide planning of transportation projects as well as construction, operation and maintenance of all state transportation systems; and

WHEREAS, projects eligible for federal funding leverage limited state dollars and should therefore be considered as priority projects; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council to provide the Governor, DOT/PF as well as the Kenai Peninsula Borough and legislative delegation from District 5 adequate information to represent the desires of the City concerning the department's transportation projects as they affect the Homer area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Homer, Alaska that the following Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT/PF) construction projects are identified as priority projects for legislative funding in Fiscal Year 1989:


