RESOLUTION 88-102

A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOMER FINDING THE NEED TO CREATE THE SALTWATER DRIVE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND SETTING A DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING.

WHEREAS, the Homer City Council has adopted the Homer Accelerated Road Reconstruction Program, and

WHEREAS, a majority of the voters of the City of Homer approved Proposition #2 for an increased sales tax rate for street reconstruction and related utilities; and

WHEREAS, Saltwater Drive falls within the guidelines of the Homer Accelerated Roads Program as a Group IV, non-maintained road for reconstruction to gravel standards; and

WHEREAS, a petition for the reconstruction of Saltwater Drive was initiated by one of the property owners and submitted with 64% of the value of the property to be benefited property owners signatures;

WHEREAS, there is a need for water and sewer utilities to be installed prior to road reconstruction;

WHEREAS, a petition has been requested for circulation for water/sewer utilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Homer that it is the intent of the City to form a road reconstruction improvement district for Saltwater Drive, contingent upon water and sewer utilities being installed prior to any road reconstruction and that a public hearing will be held during the regular City Council meeting of Monday, November 28, 1988 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of hearing protests against the formation of said road reconstruction improvement district;


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is authorized to compile the necessary information, boundaries and begin to prepare plans for the improvement in order to notify the property owners of such cost and the date of the hearing publicized as required by law.
