RESOLUTION 88-30

A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL FINDING THE NEED TO CREATE THE HIGHLAND DRIVE/UPLAND COURT ROAD RECONSTRUCTION IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND SETTING A DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING.

WHEREAS, the Homer City Council has adopted the Homer Accelerated Road Reconstruction Program, and

WHEREAS, a majority of the voters of the City of Homer approved Proposition #2 for an increased sales tax rate for street reconstruction and related utilities; and

WHEREAS, Highland Drive/Upland Court falls within the guidelines of the Homer Accelerated Road Program as a Group IV, Non-maintained road for reconstruction to gravel standards; and

WHEREAS, a petition for road reconstruction of Highland Drive was initiated by one of the property owners and submitted with 52% of the value of the property to be benefited property owners signatures;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Homer City Council that it is the intent of the City to create such an improvement district and that a public hearing will be held during the regular City Council meeting of Monday, May 9th, 1988 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of hearing protests against the creation of said improvement district;


