RESOLUTION 88-54

A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CUSTOMS SERVICE TO IMPOSE PENALTIES COMMENSURATE WITH THE VIOLATION.

WHEREAS, the importation of drugs into the United States is a significant hazard and detriment to the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the United States Customs Service has taken a lead role in interdicting these illicit drugs; and

WHEREAS, this interdiction of drugs will rebound to the benefit of the people of Homer, Alaska; and

WHEREAS, Kevin Hogan has been an established and upstanding resident of Homer, Alaska for the past fourteen (14) years; and

WHEREAS, information has been provided to us documenting that Kevin Hogan has taken a strong, public position against alcohol and other drugs in the fishing industry in which he has been involved; and

WHEREAS, the Council has become aware of the seizure of Kevin Hogan's vessel by the United States Customs Service because a new crew member, with no prior criminal record or known involvement with drugs, was found to possess 1.7 grams of marijuana; and

WHEREAS, the United States Customs Service has found that Kevin Hogan had no knowledge of such crew member's use and/or possession; and

WHEREAS, there must be some sense of proportionality between a wrong and the ensuing penalty or basic concepts of justice are violated; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that it would be significantly counter-productive to the United States Customs Service interdiction policy for it to forfeit the vessel or impose a substantial penalty upon an owner-captain in the circumstances described above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Homer City Council respectfully requests that our Alaska Delegation investigate this apparent disproportionate penalty; and
