The committee discussed the layout of the report and noted areas that were difficult to read and made suggestions regarding headers and columns to make it more reader friendly.

They reviewed the discrepancies that were noted and discussed the challenges with parking and maneuverability on the loose gravel, specifically the automated parking meter at ramp 3. Ms. Dally commented that a lot of the time charter boats will pick up people with disabilities at the launch ramp but it's a very chaotic area and the crosswalks are confusing. The improvements recommended for the area would make it a lot safer for everyone and a covered waiting area would be helpful.

Regarding the Fishing Lagoon, they talked about issues with the tides and winter time ice impacting the accessibility improvements that are there now. One suggestion was to install posts and some type of light penetrating boardwalk on that could go down to the water and potentially be removed in the winter time. It might allow a lot of the sand and gravel to fall through and be easier to maintain. They use those types of surfaces in Soldotna and along the Russian River. Ms. Dally said she's fish there and they work really well. Councilmember

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Aderhold suggested there might be grant funding available through Fish and Game or Dingle-Johnson funds.

Other talking points included the recommendation to include fish disposal buckets at the cleaning stations, the Bait Box machine and the surface around it, the doors on the new restrooms, and people parking in accessible parking who don't have a permit.

In discussing next steps, the committee asked this to go to the Harbormaster and the Port and Harbor Commission, and that they have an opportunity to talk to the commission about it. City Clerk Jacobsen said she'd check into getting them scheduled as a visitor at an upcoming meeting.
