




Q18: How long have you lived in the Greater Homer area?

Q20: Where do you live or own property in the Greater Homer Area?






City of Homer Median Household Income (U.S. Census) = \$69,757




Q3: What three things do you find most challenging about living in Homer? **Top Four Emerging Themes.**

Emerging Theme (in descending order of frequency)	Examples	Percent of responses
Overall Cost of Living		24%
Infrastructure and Transportation	poor pedestrian and biking safety and infrastructure; lack of road maintenance; unreliable air travel	17%
Affordable Housing for Residents	limited rental options; and the impact of seasonal vacation rentals on the housing market; lack of workforce housing	14%
Concerns about Overdevelopment	Increased noise and traffic, especially during the tourist season; influx of new residents with differing values; habitat destruction 14	10%


Q4: How would you rate Homer as a place to raise a family?


A combined 88% rate Homer as an excellent/good place to raise a family.





Q11: What is your preference for community/economic growth in 96 responses Homer? (increased population, jobs, specific industries expanding, etc.)? Responses to "other:"




