A. ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan Update

Deputy City Clerk Tussey provided a brief update on the plan revisions she made, and upcoming meetings she had with Dan Gardner, Public Works Superintendent and Aaron Glidden, Port Maintenance Supervisor, to go over timeline designations. The committee discussed items from the draft plan and follow-up topics, specifically:

- The blank column pertaining to the committee's recommendation to Council,
- Information regarding who is responsible for airport improvements,
- Costs to replace the grating outside the upper City Hall entrance and the possibility of using alternative materials that could be sourced from local businesses,
- Consensus/concerns regarding the timeline definitions used and gathering timeline information from City staff,
- How issues have been organized: recurring, completed, N/A, or need to be prioritized by staff,
- Concerns on "routine building maintenance" not being listed properly in City policy,
- Having an introduction narrative, what should be included in it, and providing a list of points to Committee Member Aderhold to prepare a draft.

VISITORS

The committee agreed to return to Visitors to allow a person from the public to share an ADA compliance-related project he's been working on.

Raiden Skorski-O'donnell, 6th grade student at McNeil Canyon Elementary, presented to the committee a science fair project he has been working on that focuses on accessibility at local businesses for people with disabilities or use wheelchairs. The committee discussed the project with Mr. Skorski-O'donnell and suggested he present his findings to City Council at a future meeting. They thanked him for his presentation.

NEW BUSINESS

A. TITLE III ADA Exemptions Applied to Religious Entities that Serve the City Residents

Acting Chair Dally read the title, noting that it may be a moot point if City Council is no longer going to provide monies to the non-profit that it was in regards to. City Clerk Jacobsen confirmed that the resolution failed. There was brief discussion on how State/City funding to religious entities prompts Title III, requiring ADA accessibility in religious facilities.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

A. Election Stakeholder's Group Update – Verbal Report by Committee Members Aderhold and Geisler

Committee Member Geisler provided a brief update on the on-going efforts of the Election Stakeholder's Group, which also includes Committee Member Aderhold and City Clerk Jacobsen, to improve voting accessibility in the Kenai Peninsula Borough. The committee discussed the existing voting process and the possible outcomes of the group's work.
