RE: EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE ADOPT A PARK PROGRAM

Background

During the regular meeting under New Business the Commissioners reviewed the proposed Adopt A Park Program and agreed that it would benefit the city owned parks and recreation opportunities and requested a memorandum be sent to Council to express their support of adopting this program. An excerpt of that discussion in the minutes follows:

She acknowledged the input from various staff members and expressed that the City Manager would like to take this to the next meeting of City Council with the support of the Commission. She informed the Commissioners that with the assistance of Ms. Otteson, and research on how other cities implemented their program the wheel did not need to be re-invented. They designed the program to give Ms. Otteson a bit more latitude in working with the various donors and groups.
