10. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

A. City Manager's Report

City Manager Wrede reported Buccaneer Energy will have public hearings on Wednesday, October 24th at Bidarka at 6:00 p.m. and Thursday, October 25th at McNeil Canyon School at 6:30 p.m. They will be talking about drilling out East End Road and the jackup rig.

DOT has a public hearing tomorrow from 4:00 - 7:00 p.m. to talk about the Sterling Highway erosion response, in particular the area just north of Anchor Point. They meeting will be at City Hall.

City Manager Wrede announced two awards will be recognized at the next council meeting: Karen Hornaday Park Playground Project (HoPP) – 2011 Facility Excellence Award and Homer Parks and Community Recreation – 2011 Outstanding Organization Award.

Last Thursday Cook Inletkeeper had a meeting to disucss the Buccaneer jackup rig. When the City first agreed to allow the jackup rig at the dock it was agreed it was a vessel. It was a barge with its legs up that would stay for 8 days. The story has since changed. Vessel work was not done in Singapore. There is a laundry list of repairs including painting, welding, and safety measure. Between 26-27 people are working two shifts around the clock on the jackup rig. It has not yet received Coast Guard certification to leave for the drilling site. The departure date has been set back a couple times. Repairs will not take longer than October 31st.

The legs on the jackup rig being down has caused controversy. The legs were extended 15 to 20 ft.; they are not in a pinned position. The legs are down enough to create enough of a drag so that the vessel cannot move laterally. Before the legs were extended the rig was pushing up against or pulling away from the dock. It does not ride very well at the dock due to its triangular shape. It draws 16 ft. and is really heavy with the super structure on top. Once the wind started blowing it got a little hair. The engineers say anything over 30 knot winds and we are in trouble. We had 35 and 40 knot winds and there was damage to the dock. Three tugs were working at up to 50% power to keep the rig there. After a meeting with all the officials, the sensible answer was to put the legs down. There is controversy whether the critical habitat area applies at the dock. Municipal tidelands are exempt, but that conflicts with State Statutes. Fish and Game has to resolve the issue. We are trying to plan for what happens if the jackup rig does not leave. Their

window is getting smaller and they will have to prepare if they want to be here all winter. We told Buccaneer if they want to stay here for the winter they will have to have the legs down. It is up to Buccaneer to talk to Fish and Game for a special area permit to allow it.

Council discussed the need for Buccaneer Energy to have insurance and to see if AML will cover the City. There has been controversy on the rig being here, but just as strong support from the business community to keep it here. It has been a tough season and the jackup rig keeps folks working.

Council commented if the rig is allowed to stay here the first concern is safety, then to make sure the City profits from their presence. The vessel should be charged to reflect 16 ft. of draft. Homer profits from assuming liability and the eyesore.

The jackup rig is using up the entire face of the Deep Water Dock, including the dolphins. We are turning commerce away. The Tustumena is about to be laid up for repairs and the Kennicott will be visiting twice per month. We may ask Buccaneer to move the rig to the inside of the dock. They will hire engineers to do a geotechnical survey so they won't get the legs stuck and there is no damage to pilings.

A portion of the Deep Water Dock is close to the edge of city limits. A survey should be conducted for the goal of annexing that portion of land to consider harbor expansion.

City Manager Wrede noted the more immediate concern is three-fourths of the dock is on land that the City leases from the State of Alaska. City Planner Abboud is working with the Borough and State to get tidelands conveyed to the City.

The jackup rig is generating quite a bit of sales tax. Workers are spending a lot of money in hotels, restaurants, and on parts. We have not yet looked into collection property tax from the jackup rig.

The City received a letter there were no invasive species found on the jackup rig. The Port and Harbor Director has the right to board and inspect any vessel.

Other concerns include notifying FAA of the height of the jackup rig for airplane safety. The rig presents a visual impairment to view the bay; there is a 35 ft. building height restriction in the view shed.

A copy of Buccaneer's blow out plan was requested at the October 8th meeting, but has not yet been provided. City Manager Wrede will make an official request.

City Manager Wrede reported there have been two neighborhood meetings on the gas line. Overall, it is going well. We are trying hard to get the information out there. We remain as neutral as we can and some people think we are not spending enough time talking about the benefits. Others think we are glossing it over with no risk or downside. We aim to be as transparent as possible and get as much information to the public as possible. Any ideas for improvement are welcome.
