Mayor Pro Tempore Lord commented about her challenging travels home from Juneau with the recent snowy weather, and the cool part of being able to talk with others in the same situation and realize the importance of a reliable transportation network.

Councilmember Venuti commended Mayor Pro Tem Lord for running a good meeting, and shared that she supports a train to Homer. She recognized Planning Commissioner Syverine

She attended the Planning Commissions neighborhood meeting on the proposed medical district and appreciated how well they ran the meeting and hearing from people in the proposed area.
