At the March 23rd regular meeting Homer City Council adopted Emergency Ordinance 20-15 to suspend Advisory Board and Commission meetings for 60 days. The suspension expires on May 22nd.

I've followed up with each advisory body's staff liaison, as many are tasked with Emergency Operation Center duties, and most are prepared to resume regular meeting schedules as follows:

- Planning Commission meet May 20th and resume regular schedule beginning on June 3
- Port and Harbor Advisory Commission resume regular meeting schedule beginning May 27
- Library Advisory Board resume regular meeting schedule beginning August 4
 - LAB has no regular meetings scheduled in June and July
- Parks Art Recreation & Culture Advisory Commission staff requests resuming regular schedule beginning August 20
 - PARCAC has no business pending and nothing anticipated prior to their August meeting
- Economic Development Advisory Commission decisions need to be made prior to resuming EDC meetings related to staffing and scope of work
 - EDC staff liaison Jenny Carroll and Deputy Clerk Rachel Tussey are currently fully tasked with Public Information Officer duties related to COVID-19 and Ms. Carroll is making efforts to accommodate grant processes for necessary City fundings and preparing for the Capital Improvement Plan
 - Legislation has not been established to revise the EDC's duties and responsibilities in City Code

I anticipate the meetings will be held virtually until further notice.

PROGRESS STATUS REPORT New Homer Police Station April 9, 2020 through May 7, 2020

Work Completed this Period:

Hung exterior doors. Installed interior and exterior door hardware. Seal all exposed concrete flooring. Prime/install/paint jail cell doors. Prime/install/paint (4) max security cell ceilings. Exterior site concrete. Interior stair railings. Mechanical and Electrical trim. Install detainee lockers in booking. Install cell toilet/sink units. Install cell furniture. Installation of office furniture.

Work to be Performed Next Period:

HVAC balancing. Installation of IT systems, alarm systems and commissioning. Installation of site Art. Prep for asphalt. Begin landscaping. Build Evidence storage shed on east side. Punchlist.

Schedule Status:

Project is approximately 91% complete. Occupancy may be delayed due the logistics of the Fire Hall backup generator being interfaced with existing Police Station generator. A single generator serves BOTH buildings with HEA power running through the generator prior feeding the stations and must be retrofit to two separate systems in order to take the existing generator to the new HPS site. New Fire Hall back-up generator is scheduled to be online by May 22nd, allowing existing/new generator swap to commence on or about June 1. See below.

Anticipated Problems:

COVID-19 pandemic protocols have impacted vendor and supply chain, freight and overall stability of the schedule. CDC, State of Alaska and COH guidelines have been implemented and adhered to. This Public Works project is considered an essential project and work will resume in a restricted manner until advised otherwise. Conditions change daily.

At this point we are still on schedule, **however**, **Dispatch Furniture supplier**, (Watson), has advised our subcontractor, Pro Comm. Alaska, that as of 3/30/20 their manufacturing plant will be shuttered until April 20, causing about a 1 month delay in the dispatch furniture. The overall effect on occupancy date because of this is fluid and a delay is expected.

Cornerstone General Contractors has issued a letter stating that there are anticipated delays beyond their control due this COVID-19 situation. Letter was attached to the last report.

The purpose of this memo is to update the City Manager on current construction contingency status on the police station project. Typical changes to the work necessitate use of the contingency. City requested changes and unforeseen site conditions come from the City contingency. Design and execution changes come from the Cornerstone contingency. Any remaining Cornerstone contingency is shared equally with the City of Homer and Cornerstone General Contractors at the end of the project. This project is approximately 91% complete as of May 7, 2020.

Original Cornerstone GC/CM Contract Amount - \$6,064,758

Changes/Contract Modifications to date:

Mod #1 – this modification supplements the initial civil portion to arrive at the total GC/CM contract amount above.

Mod #2 - \$16, 467.00 - For over excavation required due subsurface condition encountered. No betterments.

Mod #3 - \$5,154.00 - Add toilet/sink on cell #6 – not captured in design review. No betterments.

Mod #4 – (-1,552.00) - Deductive change/credit for simplification of generator placement.

Mod #5 - \$7,748.00 – Add H2O shut offs, auto door openers, FRP deduct

Mod #6 - \$16,845 - Add electrical requested by COH

Current Cornerstone GC/CM Contract Amount - \$6,109,420

Contingency Amounts at GMP Contract:

City of Homer - \$85,000 Cornerstone - \$147,921

Contingency Status:

City of Homer - \$40,338.00 remains – 53% of this contingency has been used to date Of this \$40,338, \$17,000 will be used for the generator swap *not yet contracted*. Owners remaining contingency is realistically in the \$23,000 range. Cornerstone - \$47,737.00 remains –68% of this contingency has been used to date.







To Homer City Council

Hi,

My name is Mark Zeiset. I am a City of Homer resident, a business owner that is directly across from the Seafarer Memorial parking on the Homer Spit and I am on the Homer Port and Harbor commission.

I am writing in concern with Resolution 20-008.

My first concern with resolution 20-008 is that it states 45 parking spaces. This is incorrect as there are between 97 and 100 vehicles pictured in the Seafarer lot map provided by the city council.

As a business owner that is across from this parking lot nearly every day of the year I see many vehicles park in that area. During the busy times of summer (May, June, July, August and into September) there are vehicles that spill over the edges of the road, double parking, and vehicles parking in many of the businesses parking lots but are not using those businesses.

I will get many people that wonder into my store throughout the summer asking if we know who owns a specific vehicle because it is blocking them in. I also see a dozen or so "close calls" with pedestrians walking in that parking lot behind cars or on the road because the lot is packed. This is a safety issue. I have also seen fender benders in the lot last summer because of the lot being packed and unorganized.

Because of these issues I recommend that the City of Homer fails this resolution or puts it on hold. I think a lot more thought and planning needs to go into this area before decisions are made. There needs to be organization and safety. There needs to be an area for pedestrians. There needs to be a clear Entry/Exit to and from the parking area.

Also as a Port and Harbor Commissioner I am sad to see this area be made into something before the expensive parking study is done. Maybe we should make decisions after the parking study of the Homer Spit is completed. Also the Port and Harbor has not been able to work on this since our meeting have been canceled for several months now due to the pandemic we are in. I think it would be better to make this type of decision with more from Port and Harbor as well as the Planning Commission.

I am not in favor of paving the Spit or this area but I do think we need a well thought out plan before moving ahead. I believe compromise can come from both sides and we can keep the green space but not shrink the existing parking that is already too small and over loaded.

Again I ask that this resolution fail or at least be put on hold so the Port and Harbor, and Planning Commission can weigh in and so the Homer Spit Parking study can be used to help with any decisions we make.
