Thank you for your assistance in sustaining our organization through the past year when the Coronavirus pandemic changed the way the library did business, and in turn, the way Friends of Homer Public Library (FHL) supported library programs and services. Without fundraising opportunities, the Nerg1 and Nerg2 monies were critical for the health of our organization.

While we have not been able to gather in the library during Covid19 and share favorite programs, thanks to these relief packages and your efforts to administer the funds, FHL has been able to support virtual youth programs such as author visits, Little Maker Club, coding classes, and a storytelling/book discussion series for youth and families to celebrate African American History Month.
