SPH Updates

- Over this past weekend:
 - 242 test samples, resulted 26 positives = 10.7% Gave 35 vaccines
- Visitation remains restricted
- Long Term Care open for designated visitors by appointment
- Test & Vaccine Clinic on Bartlett Street
 - Open 7 days a week 9am-5pm for vaccine; 9am-6pm for testing;
 - Tues/Fri has all three vaccine options; Pfizer offered daily
 - 3rd vaccine dose available for immuno-compromised
 - Boosters expected soon – pending final approvals
- UNDER CONSTRUCTION – to operationalize Covid;
 - Looking at adding more negative pressure rooms
 - Expanding into the back area of the Test & Vaccine clinic to create private infusion areas for the monoclonal antibody treatments

Sept. 9 White House announcement includes actions related to SPH:

- Requiring COVID-19 vaccinations for workers in most health care settings that receive Medicare or Medicaid reimbursement, including, but not limited to, hospitals, dialysis facilities, ambulatory surgical settings, nursing homes and home health agencies.
- Doubling the number of Department of Defense clinician teams deployed to support hospitals battling surges in COVID-19 cases.
- Increasing the shipments of monoclonal antibody treatments and expanding the types of providers who can administer these treatments to include pharmacists.
- Prioritizing and supporting booster rollout
