a. Worksession Report

There was no Council work session.

b. Committee of the Whole Report

Council Member Aderhold reported the Council addressed a minor typo in Resolution 24-019 that the Clerk will correct. They discussed Resolution 24-022 and House Bill 3, and preliminary work on the Land Allocation Plan. Economic Development Manager Engebretsen presented on a property the city purchased in the Bridge Creek Watershed, Jack Gist Park and associated parking issues, the spit property where city camping, Pier 1 Theater, and the haul out facility are competing uses, and the parcel that was purchased for a future Public Works complex. They also heard public comment, which is always appreciated.

c. Mayor's Report

Mayor Castner reported there's a lot going on in the City right now. A large number of the Commissions have been attending Council meetings, and he appreciate the work they've been doing. He's looking forward to attending the Boat Show in Anchorage with the members of the Marine Trades and Harbor personnel. It's the first time he'll be attending.

d. Borough Report

e. Port and Harbor Advisory Commission

Commissioner Bruce Friend thanked Council for appropriating the funds to continue the harbor general investigation. The Commission is looking forward to considering and making recommendations on competing uses in the area of the haul-out. There are a lot of big boats using the haul-out and the Commission has been discussing it. They're working on a memorandum of understanding with the City on the campground management, and a suggested code update related to leasing. He noted movie Cruise Boom that will be playing at the theater, and that they're looking forward to the community being involved in seeing how Sitka has been impacted. The Commission supports Ordinance 24-09 and the amendments to the Port and Harbor Tariff, and they've been having ongoing conversations with staff and DOT regarding collection of right of way monies and drainage improvements to increase parking. They're also talking about the traffic load in the area near the proposed new hotel. The Commission supports the PIP application for float repair grant, and the sublease for Bob's Trophy Charters. They'll review Resolution 24-024 at their February meeting.

f. Americans with Disabilities Act Compliance Committee

Council Member Aderhold reported the Board discussed the ongoing work on the Trails Transition Plan and hope to see the final draft at their next meeting. They discussed the joint work session with Council that was scheduled in March, but several members are unavailable, so they're looking forward to meeting with Council at a later date. They reviewed and had good discussion on the Bayview Park Plan and heard public comments regarding the need for clearing snow on the Fairview trail. She shared that she announced her resignation from the ADA Board Council Member seat and encouraged interested members submit an application.

Council Member Aderhold expressed her support for the ordinance and appreciation for the work the Personnel Director did in bringing this to us.

Mayor Castner shared his appreciation for the thoughtfulness that went into the discussion leading up to this ordinance.

Council Member Venuti appreciates the clear communication about what funds are affected by this change. She thinks it addresses the disparity and also appreciates the discussions they've had regarding this.

Mayor Castner opened the public hearing.

Scott Adams, city resident, commented regarding parking fee changes, removal of the seasonal pass, and commercial vehicles hauling vessels back and forth who are still able to get an annual pass. He questions when people park in day use with a long term permit will they get a citation for having the

wrong permit. He thinks we should be looking at annual passes for people who use the harbor for other than commercial or industrial.

There were no other comments and the hearing was closed.

ADERHOLD/VENUTI MOVED TO ADOPT ORDINANCE 24-09 BY READING OF TITLE ONLY FOR SECOND AND FINAL READING.

Council Member Aderhold asked if Port Director Hawkins could provide an overview of parking changes in the tariff.

Port Director Hawkins explained the Load and Launch ramp fee is a proposed increase from \$20 to \$25 per launch, \$13 for launch and \$12 for parking. They are proposing not to sell an annual pass to commercial operators, and there will still be an annual pass for private operators. Annual passes for day use in paved area at ramps 1-4 and the Boathouse Pavillion parking lot annual passes change from \$200 down to \$150 per year, and the long term parking annual pass would be \$150 per vehicle per year. The reasoning for the reduction is that an annual pass can no longer be used for two vehicles per pass, as they have been in the past. No physical permits will be issued, it will be tied to the vehicle license plate.

Mayor Castner questioned if the people who have businesses near the prime spots will fill the spots? It's a heck of a deal for summer parking. Port Director Hawkins agreed that's possible but they'll watch for the year and see if it needs to be addressed.

d. City Manager/Finance Director. Recommended dates Introduction January 22, 2024 Public Hearing and Second Reading February 12, 2024.

Mayor Castner opened the public hearing.

Scott Adams, city resident, commented he sat through the Planning Commission meetings regarding this matter. The traffic impact analysis only addressed pedestrians, and nothing about turning traffic into the development or on to Kachemak Drive. It's flawed because it's not looking at the big picture.

Mike Stark, Homer resident, noted the traffic analysis was specifically meant to deal with the impact of trips per hour for the proposed complex so the scope of the study didn't go beyond that. He agrees it would behoove the City to have an in-depth analysis of that area.

ADERHOLD/VENUTI MOVED TO ADOPT ORDINANCE 24-10 BY READING OF TITLE ONLY FOR SECOND AND FINAL READING.

Council Member Aderhold briefly explained this ordinance is the City receiving money from Doyon for costs related to the traffic impact analysis for their project. The work has been done and any perceived deficiencies aren't pertinent to this ordinance.

Mayor Castner concurred this action is to approve the pass through and noted we need to put a tickler in to talk about how we want to do this in the future, because the study wasn't all that helpful to the Planning Commission from his perspective.

Dave Berry, Library Director, commented a delegation from Teshio coming to Homer likely won't happen in 2024. Other options are being considered, like a virtual conference or other some other form of outreach. Other parts of the project are moving ahead at full speed, the Pratt Museum exhibit is under-way and should be ready to go at the start of May. The banners for Pioneer Avenue are in the design phase, with Rachel Tussey lending her expertise on the design.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

a. City Manager's Report

City Manager Dumouchel noted his report in the packet and highlighted the graph and increase of annual calls for the Homer Volunteer Fire Department, we should be proud of the service they provide the community with the resources they have. He shared that the Master Transportation Plan is on its way to the Planning Commission in March, then to Council; and that multiple Homer projects were referenced in the State Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP). The STIP is pending approval by federal agencies, it doesn't guarantee funding for the project, but it positions us to be eligible and more competitive for funding. He also touched on the upcoming showing of the movie Cruise Boom on February 27th at Homer Theater, the movie addresses the impacts of tourism and cruise ships on Sitka, Alaska; and February 20th Chuck Marohn from Strong Towns will be speaking at the Kachemak Bay Campus.

There was brief discussion questioning the debt service schedule on the Police Station Bond, timing to retire the note, and when it would be feasible to bring a question to the voters to extend the sales tax for the purpose of funding a Recreation Center. City Manager Dumouchel said he will work with Finance to prepare an updated report for February 26th, and noted that there is a 10 year window where the City has to make payments before it can be paid off.

Council Member Venuti wished everyone Happy Valentine's Day and encouraged shopping locally for gifts. She welcomed Public Works Director Kort who stayed for all the meetings. She missed Council Member Lord tonight and shared condolences to her family on the passing of Steve Gibson. She thanked the Mayor for planning to attend the meeting with DOT.

Council Member Aderhold commented about walking to Save U More recently and couldn't tell if she was on the sidewalk or the side of the road because the sidewalks weren't cleared. She also reminded the public to stop for pedestrians waiting at the cross walk to cross the road, that's the law.

Council Member Davis welcomed Public Works Director Kort. He had the opportunity to walk on Pioneer Avenue to Main Street yesterday and the conditions are pretty dicey, like Mr. Case mentioned in his comments.

Council Member Erickson recognized over the last couple weeks we've lost several people who have been here for years, Steve Gibson, Willy Flyum, and Bob Haines. She shared some of her memories and emphasized the importance of recording family stories. She's looking forward to the movie Cruise Boom, she thinks it's important because it's starting to affect Homer in ways we haven't realized.
