Ms. Jacobsen,

HCC 21.93.010 states: "This chapter governs administrative appeals to a hearing officer from actions or determinations taken under the Homer Zoning Code." No specific procedure is prescribed in HCC 21.93 relating to litigation discovery or to the disclosure of public records following an appeal hearing. While the public records at issue might *pertain* to OAH-23-0320-MUN, briefing and oral argument have been completed in that matter so the subject public records are no longer relevant to it; I am not seeking to supplement the closed record. Former City Manager Dumouchel did not deny my February 26th public records request on litigation grounds, he stated: "Additional time is needed to respond to this request and is expected to be completed by Wednesday, March 20th." Please reconsider your denial of my February 26th public records request and disclose the public records to me or consider this my Notice of Appeal to the Homer City Council pursuant to HCC 2.84.070 and Regulation 5.04.

This decision is based on Homer City Code 2.84.055 Litigation which reads follows:

If a person requesting inspection of City records is involved in litigation, a quasi-judicial proceeding, or an appeal involving the City or a City agency in any judicial or administrative forum, the disclosure of records used for, included in, or relevant to that litigation, proceeding or appeal is governed by the rules or orders of that forum, and not by this chapter. In this section, "involved in litigation" means being a party to litigation, a quasi-judicial proceeding or appeal, or representing a party, including any person obtaining records on behalf of the party.

You are the appellant of a matter on appeal before the Office of Administrative Hearings regarding Conditional Use Permit 23-04/01 for the property located at 106 W. Bunnell Avenue, and this is a closed appeal record, so the code referenced above applies.

My February 26, 2024 public records request was approved by City Manager Rob Dumouchel on March 11, 2024 at which time he informed me that it would be completed by Wednesday, March 20th. "Your" March 20, 2024 letter to me does not expressly state that you overturned Mr. Dumouchel's approval of my February 26, 2024 public records request, it merely states that you are now unable to release the public records I requested. Regulation 5.01 mandates: "If the City Manager makes an adverse determination, in whole or in part, [to] a written public records request, the City manager will provide a written response setting forth the adverse determination." HCC 2.84.060(a) provides that "The City Manager will provide a reasonably prompt response to each request." I did not *promptly* receive any written response setting forth an adverse determination; I was promptly informed by City Manager Dumouchel that my records request would be completed by March 20, 2024. Regulation 5.01 further mandates: "The City Manager's (adverse) written response will also include a notice that the requestor has a right to appeal to the city council." I received no such notice from Mr. Dumouchel or from you. It is you, not I, who apparently needs direction as to following public record request procedures. HCC 2.84 does not state what rules or orders apply to the disclosure of City of Homer public records in administrative appeal forums such as the OAH and the Homer City Council, nor does it identify any provision of law that authorizes an acting city manager to retroactively deny a citizen's access to public records after his public records request has been approved by a duly appointed city manager. I filed my Notice of Appeal to the Homer City Council with you yesterday at 3:53 P.M. with cc to Deputy City Clerk Krause but hereby refile it with you and Ms. Krause.

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Renee,

The subject records are relevant to my pending administrative appeal to the Homer City Council of Acting City Manager Melissa Jacobsen's March 20, 2024 de facto denial of my February 26, 2024 public records request. The basis for her decision to withhold those public records was HCC 2.84.055 which provides that records relevant to an administrative appeal "are governed by the rules or orders of that forum, and not by this chapter." It would follow that the instant administrative appeal to the Homer City Council would also be governed by the rules or orders of that forum and not by HCC 2.84 i.e., the standard public records request procedures which you are presumably now asking me to follow. I am unaware of any rules or orders prescribed in HCC governing disclosure of public records relevant to OAH 23-0320-MUN or to my pending appeal to the Homer City Council. If there are such rules or orders, please elucidate me. If there are not, please elucidate Ms. Jacobsen. In the absence of such rules or orders, it stands to reason that the regular rules pertaining to written requests for public records under HCC 2.84 and related Regulations apply. Note that AS 40.25.122 (Litigation Disclosure) is prefaced by the following: "A public record that is subject to disclosure and copying under AS 40.25.110 - 40.25.120 remains a public record subject to disclosure and copying even if the record is used for, included in, or relevant to litigation, including law enforcement proceedings, involving a public agency." The facts that OAH 23-0320-MUN involved a closed record and that briefing and oral argument have long been completed precludes any possibility that the records I requested could now be entered into the record or otherwise affect the Administrative Law Judge's Decision. In any event, if public records regarding the pending appeal to the Homer City Council can be disclosed to me via my submittal of a standard public records request form, then so too can the public records I requested on February 26, 2024 regarding OAH 23-0320-MUN. If the records I requested on February 26, 2024 are disclosed to me, my appeal to the Homer City Council would be moot. I would appreciate your response to the following questions:

- 1. Other than those prescribed under HCC 2.84, what rules or orders apply to requests for public records relevant to City of Homer administrative appeals?
- 2. Why would my submittal of a completed records request form for records

relevant to the pending Homer City Council administrative appeal result in disclosure of those records when my February 26, 2024 public records request resulted in no disclosure of public records?

3. What provision of HCC 2.84 or the City of Homer Public Records Request Regulations requires a requester of public records to complete the city's public request form i.e., why isn't my current written discovery request sufficient?

- 2. No provision of HCC 2.84.055 stipulates any rules or orders governing the disclosure of public records relevant to administrative appeals before the City Council.

- 6. You do not have the authority to deny a discovery request or a public records request. While Acting City Manager Melissa Jacobsen retroactively denied my February 26. 2024 public request, she did not deny my ensuing discovery request for public records.
- 7. The question currently before the City Council is whether to disclose the public records I requested on February 26, 2024. All questions regarding the introduction of evidence into the record on appeal should be decided by the City Council well in advance of the hearing. I would like to call former City Manager Rob Dumouchel and have asked for his contact information but received no response. I do not know what procedures apply to the calling of witnesses or taking their testimony. While not mandatory, it would be extremely helpful if a procedural notice were prepared by the City Council and distributed well in advance of the hearing.
- 8. I promptly responded to your inquiry regarding my availability. You did not state that 8-5 was a parameter. Pursuant to Regulation 5.03, I hereby demand a written response from the City Manager as to whether my March 21, 2024 public records request is approved or denied, in whole or in part. If I do not receive a response from the City Manager (or Acting City Manager) within 3 working days of this demand, I will consider my March 21, 2024 public records request to be deemed denied by the City Manager and I will appeal that deemed denial to the Homer City Council in accordance with Regulation 5.03, Regulation 5.04, and HCC 2.84.070.

All *approved* public record request applications where applicant indicated that he/she was involved in litigation, a quasi-judicial proceeding, or in some judicial or administrative forum involving the City of Homer or an agency thereof. At this point I am not requesting the records that were disclosed, I am just requesting the (approved) applications for those public records.
- 2. All *denied* public record request applications where applicant indicated he/she was involved in litigation, a quasijudicial proceeding, or any judicial or administrative forum involving the City of Homer or an agency thereof.

- 3. All rules and/or orders applicable to the disclosure of City of Homer public records in administrative appeal forums such as the OAH and the Homer City Council.
- 4. All provisions of HCC or other applicable law that authorizes an acting Homer city manager to retroactively deny a citizen's public records request after it has been approved by a duly appointed city manager.

On March 29, 2024, you stated in separate emails as follows: 1. The records are not available to release, and 2. You do not have the ability to release them. However, you do not have the authority to deny a public records request. Regulation 5.01 states: "If the *City Manager* makes an adverse determination, in whole or in part, [to] a written public records request, the *City Manager* will provide a written response setting forth the adverse determination. It will include a description of the records requested, a description of the records that will not be provided, and the reasons for the adverse determination, including reference to provisions of law or regulations, facts, and other information relied upon. The *City* **Manager's** written response will also include a notice that the requestor has a right to appeal to the city council." Pursuant to Regulation 5.03, I hereby demand a written response from the City Manager as to whether my March 21, 2024 public records request is approved or denied, in whole or in part. If I do not receive a response from the City Manager (or Acting City Manager) within 3 working days of this demand, I will consider my March 21, 2024 public records request to be deemed denied by the City Manager and I will appeal that deemed denial to the Homer City Council in accordance with Regulation 5.03, Regulation 5.04, and HCC 2.84.070.
