DISCUSSION TOPIC(S)

a. 2025 City of Homer Land Allocation Plan
 Memorandum CC-25-228 from the Community Development Director as backup.

Mayor Lord introduced the topic and deferred to Community Development Director Engebretsen.

Ms. Engebretsen presented the land allocation plan noting the review process and recommendations as follows:

- Land area near the Load and Launch Ramp for Overslope Development
 - Noted existing lease application status and recommendation to not offer the area for further development pending the Harbor Expansion Project
 - o Parking challenges current and future with further development
 - o Clarified that this was a policy document and can be amended at any time
- Airport Terminal
 - Limited to 5 year term leases, seeing more rapid turnover compared to the leases on the Spit which are for 20-30 years by comparison
 - o May have recommendations in the future on how to better facilitate those leases

- Lot 88-2
 - Remove from currently available list until decision is made on what to do with this property
- Main Street Parcel
 - o Interest expressed in buying the parcel from two parties in the last year
 - EDC recommends retaining property until highest and best use for the city has been ascertained i.e. public parking lot, public private partnership for housing
 - Revisit in the future when interest rates are lower
 - Note can be added to the property page for reference
 - Selling the property would add to the city property tax rolls depending on who bought the property. It was noted that many city properties are owned by nonprofits.
- Karen Hornaday Park
 - Separate action to amend the park boundaries
 - Original parcel is constrained by land and water conservation grant deed restrictions
 - Defines acquisition and constraints of each parcel that makes up the park
 - Notes added to the page on the parcel
- Lot 6 Harry Feyer Subdivision, Kachemak Drive
 - o Property listed for several years no interest in purchase
 - Lot is constrained with easements
 - Will be involved in Kachemak Drive State project
 - Remove from offer until after State project completed to determine highest and best use.
- Parking on the Homer Spit
 - Review of property use in the area of the spit near the Harbormaster Office with the proposed Harbor Expansion project in the future.
 - Port & Harbor Commission to review and make recommendations on a 5-10 year plan on what land to offer for lease.
 - Paid Parking versus Free Parking
 - o Parking Management Plan notes in the Land Allocation Plan
- HERC I and HERC II
 - Update pages to reflect current status i.e. Public Works Maintenance is still shown has occupying HERC II
 - List website where reports on the HERC can be located re: Hazardous materials

City Manager Jacobsen stated her report was in the packet and discussion was facilitated on the following:

Mayor Lord introduced Ordinance 25-54 by reading of the title noting that this was on the agenda for introduction at the August 11th meeting postponed to the September 22, 2025 meeting and referred to the Planning Commission and Economic Development Advisory Commission. Recommendations from those bodies are provided in the packet. Motion before Council.¹

DAVIS/ADERHOLD MOVED TO INTRODUCE ORDINANCE 25-54 BY READING OF TITLE ONLY.

Discussion facilitated by Mayor Lord noted the following:

- The requested action was spurred by one entity and when getting these requested Council should view how it benefits the community as a whole.
- Recommendation from Planning Commission was unexpected as Council was seeking input from the Commission on how to better this ordinance.
- Expressed appreciation for the willingness of the Economic Development Advisory Commission to work on the issue and develop a suitable recommendation.
- Preference to develop or set aside itinerant merchant or incubator designated area supporting the concerns of the Planning Commission.
- Concerns expressed by the public and Commissions on the investment of the "brick-and-mortar" businesses.
- ADA Compliance of temporary businesses
- Preference to postpone till the sponsor of the ordinance was present.

POSTPONED to the October 13, 2025 regular meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

a. Memorandum CC-25-233 from Councilmember Aderhold re: Information on the possible Consequences for Homer Elections if Kenai Peninsula Borough Citizen Initiative Propositions 1 and/or Proposition 5 on the Kenai Peninsula Borough Ballot for October 7, 2025 are Approved by the Kenai Peninsula Voters. Recommend approval.

Mayor Lord introduced the Memorandum by reading of the title and deferred to Council member Aderhold.

Councilmember Aderhold clarified that the memorandum was brought forward to provide information for the voters of the city based on the experience of participating as a member of two Borough taskforces. The results and recommendations can be found using the links provided to the final report. The following points were discussed:

- The Borough ballot propositions will not change city elections however can have an impact on city elections.
 - Added equipment costs
 - Difficulty in recruiting sufficient number of election workers
 - Additional time needed to count ballots will add costs

- Different location may be required since Chambers may not be adequate to conduct the election with the Borough due to the requirements of separate equipment, election workers, etc.
- Tabulating machines are counting the colored marks on the paper example used of school testing or exams.
- o Still require separate ballots for state, borough and city elections.
- No positive impacts could be found when considering the change in election date or hand counting of ballots.

Hopefully that's prepping her daughter for one day being on City Council. It was super funny. She expressed that it was just really great to have Jacqueline Rainwater here on Harold Sergeant, because the Kachemak Bay Recovery Program has been tremendous, and they've done such great work in our community and offering such good services, and I go to their classes whenever I can, and they are so much fun.

Council member Aderhold reported on the Lunch with a Councilmember that was attended by four members of the public who came with lists and Acting City Manager Julie Engebretsen also attended. It went very well. Councilmember Venuti is scheduled for October.
