REGULAR MEETING AGENDA

Council entertained brief discussion on the following:

- Ordinance 25-27 Rezone a Rural Residential Lot to East End Mixed Use
 - Property value is not a criterion for consideration in rezoning a property
 - Property is adjacent to the proposed zoning district however all development surrounding the property is consistent with existing zoning district until further east of the property
 - The property lays in the area where the city is working on the green infrastructure or peatland project and in conversations on proposed land purchases.
 - Permit from the Corp of Engineers is for a project consisting of six cabins not the proposed fish processing plant, while this is informative it was not relevant to the application.
 - Variances set a higher bar and the property owner is required to prove that they are unable to develop the property in the current zoning district to meet code.
 - Action is not supported by the neighboring property owners.
- Ordinance 25-07 Reimbursement to Property Owners for Lift Stations
 - Meeting with Mr. Long earlier today and laydown Memorandum CC-25-088 provides additional proposed solution to receive some relief for his expenses in purchasing and installing is own eone lift station.
 - Reimburse the property owners what they paid that shouldn't have been charged to them.
 - Clarified that the cost paid by the property owner was based on the lot size and the city and one other property owner paid more than the \$2648, the city paid \$48553 and one property owner paid \$5683
 - Determined that property owners needed a lift station and those costs should have been assigned directly to the property owners who had a lift station installed to be included in their assessment and paid over time however the six property owners that have no structures on their property could not have a lift station installed due to the freeze thaw nature in the winter.
 - Fairness to all property owners within the project.
 - This item can be postponed to the next meeting if Council chooses to do so.
 - There is still more time to discuss during the regular meeting.

COMMENTS OF THE AUDIENCE

Lisa Nolan expressed her appreciation and former concerns expressed on bringing more licenses to Homer and would be happy to meet or speak to anyone regarding the benefits that additional licenses would provide and that AMCO is not familiar with the Visitor and tourism industry in Homer.

William Roth, non-resident, expressed comments on the Denali grant breakdown and the importance to knowing the details of the project, then announced the Blessing of the Fleet event on May 21st and the event last year was super fun and they had approximately 300 people at the Seafarers Memorial, it would be nice to have that event publicized to bring people to Homer. He expressed support for the additional liquor licenses.

COMMENTS OF THE CITY ATTORNEY

City Attorney Gatti commented it was nice to be in person and see everyone tonight.

COMMENTS OF THE CITY CLERK

City Clerk Krause commented it was a great meeting and announced the vacancies on the ADA Advisory Board and Economic Development Advisory Commission along with the opportunity for a Student Commissioner on the Economic Development Advisory Commission.

COMMENTS OF THE CITY MANAGER

City Manager Jacobsen commented it was a good meeting and she will have a packet put together to include the signed resolution, minutes and what is submitted to AMCO for the Legislators.

COMMENTS OF THE MAYOR

Mayor Lord reminded everyone about the opportunities to provide comments on various topics, information and links can be found in her newsletter in the Mayor's webpage on the City website. She then commented on the recent local event, Snow Rondy at Chapman School in Anchor Point and the Chess tournament that was attended by 70 people, the event was promoted by Andy Haas and Franco Venuti donated a chess set that he made out of clay 50 years ago.

COMMENTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Councilmember Venuti commented that the young man who won the chess set came by their house to express his appreciation for the set on Saturday. She noted that this was a good meeting and expressed appreciation for the public participation and believes it really is a force in their little hamlet by the sea. Ms. Venuti then announced the Peony Celebration and encouraged everyone to save the date starting July 1st through August 17th, Amber Baldus was recognized by Anchor Point as leading Citizen and expressed her thanks for the City Manager providing homemade soup tonight, it was delicious.

Councilmember Parsons expressed his appreciation for the Clerk keeping them on track and rolling, the City Manager for providing all the information seems there is something new each meeting and expressed a special thank you to everyone who came or attended the meeting and submitted comments noting it was very helpful and powerful in a positive way.

Councilmember Aderhold expressed comments on why they are here as they represent the residents of the Community and the more input from the public the better decisions the Council can make, if there are issues 11

that is what council is here for. She then provided clarification on the permitting process for environmental permits noting that they can range from three to five years for an environmental impact statement process and one she was familiar with even took 40 years but the project is moving forward right now in Cooper Landing, sometimes the projects are really complicated and replacing our floats in the Harbor is not that complicated but still requires us to make sure there is no harm done to the waters to pollute them, add invasive species, etc. Ms. Aderhold noted that with Federal monies involved there are more checklists so there is a lot to go through for the project and thanked the people who commented in person and via Zoom or submitted letters.

Councilmember Erickson commented on Cathy Stingley being selected as Woman of Distinction and added how much fun it was to play music with her and Dr. Bell being a family doctor and his dedication to softball providing such great leadership and skills he taught those girls seeing him first hand was wonderful. It is wonderful to have two people like them volunteer in our community. She announced the Snomads Fun Run will be with ATV this weekend due to the low snow winter and the Fundraiser for the Watermelon trail easement noting the public can find more information on their website.

Councilmember Hansen commented that Dr. Bell reminded her to announce the extra softball practices during spring break and reported that he was an amazing employer and she could not do this service on the Council without his encouragement and allowing her to have the time off to also spend time with her kids doing sports events and the like. She then provided input that her first visit to Juneau for AML and Lobbying was really interesting and recounted attending her first meetings in Anchorage were very helpful. Ms. Hansen appreciated having the City Attorney in person at the meetings and putting a face to the voice.
