

As a Homer area resident (Kachemak City) who supports local Homer businesses, I would encourage you to vote yes on this ordinance and allow the sale of this lot to Grace Ridge Brewery.

They are a proven good neighbor, supporting many non-profits in our community and providing a convivial meeting place where you can actually have a conversation - unlike other places in town that serve alcohol. They would be much better located downtown. Right now both breweries are located in the same area and not near the walkable downtown area.

A couple of council members have mentioned wanting to hold the lot aside for a possible rec center. It seems a marginal size for that purpose, very near to the SPARC center and with a much larger lot available (where the HERC building is located now). I was not aware of Homer's intention to hold this lot aside for a public purpose - this seems an untimely change in purpose when this property has been for sale for years and now has a fair offer. It also seems an unlikely place for a rec center in an area of restaurants, art galleries and other small businesses.

Customer classification definitions for determining water rates:

Bulk Water Customers: The bulk water customers are the resellers of water or water users who purchase water from the water plant directly and are not in the metered water distribution system.

Non-Bulk Customers: All customers who receive water from the metered water distribution system.

Multi-Units: An additional \$5 monthly charge shall apply to each of the units of a building or lot occupied by more than one household or commercial entity contained within one building or several buildings within one complex. Examples of multi-family units include duplexes, four-plexes and up, apartments, condominiums, co-housing projects, and multiple structures on one lot (where units are normally rented or occupied for longer than one month at a time). Examples of units not considered as multi-family include hotels, motels, and B&B's seasonal rooms/cabins (where units are routinely rented or occupied for less than one month at a time.)

This fee applies to all multi-unit structures defined in the sewer section of this for apartments, rental units or multi-unit buildings where each unit would have one or more restrooms and are intended to be rented on a monthly basis where there is only one meter installed, excluding a rental building restroom used for shared or public use.

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\$750 meter deposit shall apply to metered fire hydrant connections. The deposit will be returned when the meter is returned undamaged. This deposit may be waived upon the recommendation of the Public Works Superintendent.

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If a bulk water customer purchases a meter from the City for measuring the quantity of water purchased, it shall be exempt from the monthly meter service charge. It is the responsibility of the bulk water customer to maintain that meter so the City can accurately determine the amount of water being purchased. In the event the meter fails, it is the bulk water customer's responsibility, at its expense, to repair it or purchase a replacement meter from the City. The City may at any time test the meter for accuracy.

Lift Station Zone Customer: There are eleven sewage lift/pump stations that are used for pumping wastewater or sewage from areas with lower elevation than the treatment plant.

Customers who are located in these areas shall be charged additional fees for the cost added 159 to the services (see Table I & II). 160 161 Non-Lift Station Zone Customer: Customers who are located in the zone that do not need 162 lift/pump station services. 163 164 Sewer System Dischargers (Sewer ONLY customers): Customers who use sewer service only 165 shall be charged a monthly fee of \$5 plus sewer usage fee based on assessed volume of 3,000 166 gallons per month multiplied by the applicable sewage rate (see Table II). Kachemak City Local 167 Improvement District (LID) members have contributed to the initial cost of the sewer treatment 168 plant and the collection system. For Kachemak City LID dischargers connected within the LID, 169 the City of Homer shall bill Kachemak City in one single bill at the Lift-Station Zone Rate of 170 \$73.95(\$67.20 + \$6.75) \$79.45 (\$73.20 + \$6.25) per month per customer. Kachemak City shall 171 be billed a \$5 monthly service charge to cover all Kachemak City sewer customers and shall be 172 responsible for payment to the City of Homer. 173 174 Domestic sewer service customers who use large quantities of City water in addition to their 175 domestic use shall be allowed, with the Public Works Director's approval, to install an 176 additional water meter on the domestic water use line for the purpose of metering and 177 charging for domestic sewer system use. Sewer system use will be billed monthly. 178 179 The City will allow, upon approval by Public Works and a permit from the Public Works 180 181 Department, a second water usage meter – called a seasonal sewer meter – for each customer that desires to measure the flow of City water that is not discharged to the sewer system during 182 the summer growing season, June 15 through September 15. **A-Frame PRV Station Replacement** 

The Homer City Council passed Resolutions 18-009(S) and 18-039; and Ordinance 18-10 which authorized utilizing remaining ADEC Municipal Matching Grant funds to complete the design and construction of various water distribution/storage improvements. The projects are funded through the ADEC Municipal Matching Grant program (70% grant/30% City) with the City's match financed through the low interest State Revolving Loan Program.

On June 6, 2019, bids were received for one of these projects; the replacement of the A-Frame PRV Station (originally built in 1965). The project was advertised in the Homer News on April 25 and May 2 and in the Peninsula Clarion on April 27, 2019. Competitive bidding was completed in accordance with the City's procurement regulations and grant conditions.

Three responsive bids were received from qualified firms. The bid results were evaluated and the results are as follows:

The low bid is within the overall project budget approved by the City Council and provided for in the grant. Public Works recommends awarding both the Base bid and the Additive. Bid item The Additive bid item covers the cost of upgrading the building siding from T1-11 to better looking Lap Board Composite Cement Siding.

Design of the City Hall roof was funded in the 2018 capital budget. The City Council authorized construction funds by passing Ordinance 19-18 in the amount of \$229,452.

On June 6, 2019, bids were received for the City Hall Roof replacement project. The project was advertised in the Homer News on April 16 and April 26 and in the Peninsula Clarion on April 19, 2019. Competitive bidding was completed in accordance with the City's procurement regulations.

Three responsive bids were received from qualified firms. The bid results were evaluated and the results are as follows.
