Bunnell Street Arts Center is awarded a \$150,000 ArtPlace Grant for Old Town Artist in Residence Program







Approximate City Investment

Signs: Speed Limit (5), Pedestrian Walkway (3), Rec Use (3), Crosswalk (6), Share the Road (3), Not a Through Way (1) \$4,750

Textured Pavement Widening and Lining of E. Bunnell and Beluga Pl. \$26,000

Removable Speed Bumps \$5,000

Charles Way Development \$15,000 Bishop's Parking Lot Paved and Lined \$12,000

\$62,750 + 20% Buffer= \$75,300



Solution 10 States 1 City + \$2 ArtPlace + 1\$ Neighborhood = \$4 of Improvements

Old Town Neighborhood Proposals for City Consideration:

- 1.15 MPR Speed Limit zoning
- 2. Removable speed bumps (two, E. Bunnell and Beluga Place)
- 3. E. Bunnell and Beluga Place pavement widening and texturizing (paving the shoulder)
- 4. E. Bunnell and Beluga Place traffic lane shift to north and east, respectively, and narrow
- 5. Designating the new road space on the south and west streets as pedestrian and biking lanes
- 6. Addition of cross walks and signs (three, W. Bunnell Ave, Main St and Beluga Place)
- **7.** Appropriate pedestrian and biking signage (Six: 1 Main St, 3 E. Bunnell, 2 Beluga)
- 8. Appropriate speed limit signage (Five, 1 Main St, 1 Ohlson Lane, 2 E. Bunnell, 1 Beluga Place)
- 9. Bishop's Beach parking lot paved and lined tightly
- 10. Charles Way developed as a walking and bike path, and closed to automobile traffic by bottle necking trail with boulders
- 11. Appropriate signage for use of Charles Way ("No Thru Traffic" at end of Main St looking West, and two trail head markers of Charles Way)
- 12. Dirtwork next to Bunnell Street Arts Center to build a model garden along the board walk.
