

# Learning Activity Suggestions



- Play at the Playground: Climb, slide and swing at Karen Hornaday Park or other outdoor playspace.
- Make a New Recipe: Cook, BBQ, bake or chop a meal. The library has lots of cookbooks & food magazines for the whole family.
- Write or Draw a Story: Using paper or a digital tool, write or draw about a summer adventure.
- **Go Fishing:** Catch fish wherever your family fishes, for fun, for subsistence or commercially. Alaska Fish & Game hosts free fishing days for kids at the Lagoon on 6/1 and 8/3. Some equipment provided.
- Program an Ozobot: Check out a library
   Ozobot (a tiny robot) and learn to code using color.
- **Read More:** Enjoy a nonfiction book about planets, the solar system, or space travel.





# Learning Activity Suggestions



- Become a Citizen Scientist: Observe the clouds and report what you see using NASA's GLOBE Observer app.
- Play a Sport: Get together with friends and play soccer, tennis, or basketball.
- Have a Family Dance Party: Dance together and include a new style of music. Check out the library's CDs or try YouTube.
- Design a New Game: Create and play a game you create with family or friends. Try a hand game (think: rock, paper, scissors), a board game (think: checkers), a video game (think: pong) or something different.
- Walk With a Ranger: Learn about Beluga Slough on a walk with a ranger, starting from Islands & Ocean Visitor Center. Offered daily at 11am starting on 6/9.
- **Read More:** Enjoy a chapter book about Alaska or by an Alaskan author.









- Read More: Listen to an audiobook! The library has books on CD, digital audiobooks to download, and VOX audio picturebooks.







- **Read More:** Try a book by an author or illustrator who doesn't look like you.






