- 9 As local elected officials, we are receiving significant concerns from our community members surrounding
 10 the increase in community spread of Covid-19 and the resulting closure of our schools on the Southern
- 11 Kenai Peninsula. Entering what your administration calls 'Phase III: Maximizing Healthcare capacity and
- response', the Homer City Council looks forward to working with DHSS and your staff to actively respond and support our community through this winter.

- 15 Concerns that have been directly expressed from our community include:
 - The need for **faster testing turnaround times.** It is taking up to five days, if not more, for our residents to receive test results from the State lab.
 - **Sufficient contact tracing** to ensure timely and comprehensive outreach to known close contacts of positive individuals
- Regionalized epidemiological information to help understand what's happening in our community. How
 are people contracting Covid-19 in our area? What are our hot spots, and are there targeted ways the
 community/region can respond?
- Continued/increased economic support specifically for those facing a 14-day quarantine (or isolation due to sickness) for themselves and/or dependent(s), and specifically in regards to lost wages heading into winter and beyond the timeline for the City's CARES Act funds.
 - Continued/increased mental health support
- 27 With numbers increasing daily here, our schools are closed for in-person learning through the end of
- October. Parents are again in a terrible position of trying to work, run businesses, and support their children - often without any additional childcare assistance.
- 30 As we look towards a winter of high case counts, the City of Homer stands ready to work in partnership with
- 31 your administration, Federal agencies, and community leaders to get our schools open, to support our
- 32 working families, our children, and our businesses. Together we can get through this difficult time,
- 33 maximizing every opportunity we have to respond in a timely way to mitigate social and economic harm.
