Summary Statement:

The City's Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 Capital Budget, approved by City Council via Ordinance 21-36(S2)(A), appropriated \$100,000 from the Port and Harbor Reserves in support of the Fish Grinding Building Replacement project.

In June of 2022, City administration applied for Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Act grant funds from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game to assist with project funding. The award of grant funds was recently approved by the Federal agency managing the awards and we anticipate receiving an obligating award document in January 2024. At that time, staff will prepare an Ordinance for City Council to consider for accepting and appropriating the grant funds.

The City's FY22 Capital budget appropriation will be used to meet the 25% local match requirement. However, the appropriation is set to lapse on June 30, 2024 and needs to be renewed to ensure the funds remain available.

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt Ordinance 23-63 to insure budgeted funds are available as match for Federal grant funds.
