Purpose

A City Council vacancy was created with the election of Rachel Lord as Mayor. Pursuant to Homer City Code 2.08.050(a) the Council has 30 days to fill the vacancy. An application period ran from October 28th to November 1st and following persons have applied for the vacant Council seat:

Next Steps

At the November 12th Special Meeting, Applicants will be invited to introduce themselves and make a brief presentation (10 minutes). Councilmembers may prepare one question which they will ask each applicant. Councilmembers are to submit their questions to the City Clerk by 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 12, 2024.

After the interviews are complete, the Mayor will call for a round of "Exploratory Round Robin" discussion. If the Council agrees, then no one will make a motion until every Council member has had the opportunity to share their thoughts. After everyone has had an opportunity to speak, discussion may continue and the floor will be open to nominations by motion. The Council may agree to another round of Exploratory Round Robin.

At all times, the discussion will remain germane to the information provided from the applicants on their applications and in the interviews. Nomination of an applicant for appointment will be made by the motion "I move to appoint_____ to serve until the next regular election certification."

Four affirmative votes are required for passage of the motion. If the motion fails, new motions will be necessary until four affirmative votes are received.

The person appointed will be sworn in immediately.

Dear Homer City Council,

I am submitting my name for your consideration to fill a recently vacated City Council seat created during our last election. I seek to be appointed to Council so I can continue to serve and represent members of our community in a yet more impactful way. As some of you already know, I have had the honor and the privilege to serve on the Homer ADA Advisory Board the last two years and have developed a deep connection to the people and place of Homer.

In the summer of 2012, family brought us to Homer to celebrate our son's first birthday. Surrounded by our Homer family, the natural beauty of Kachemak Bay, and the instant camaraderie felt with the people of Homer, I felt drawn to this place. At one point during that first visit I turned to my spouse and said she could drop out of graduate school and we should just figure out how to make it work. It took us many more years, but we're here now, and we're all in.

On regular Homer visits over the years, I spent hours at the old K-Bay Coffee watching the patterns of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian. I got to know Homer long before we officially moved here; both the opportunities and the challenges. I've read all the plans and followed all the controversial topics. I feel connected to Homer in ways most 3-year residents might not. I feel I've been a part of this community for far longer.

My background is in public safety, public education, and in the nonprofit sector working with individuals with disabilities. It's an odd mix, I admit, but an odd mix that developed skills that I find profoundly useful in our Cosmic Hamlet by the Sea. I rely on those skills everyday in my work at the Independent Living Center. I've also spent the last two decades volunteering. I've served on multiple non-profit boards in both Iowa and Michigan. I had the privilege to serve a year with AmeriCorps. I served four years on the Ann Arbor Transportation Commission prior to moving to Homer. It has been an easy transition to join Homer's ADA Advisory Board, particularly with how welcoming and passionate the board members and City staff have been.

Joining Homer's City Council feels like a calling at this point. I have never sought public office, but now feels like the time. I am committed to this community, inspired by my Homer community members, and I feel that joining Council is the next step in supporting Homer to become the City it aspires to be. Dear Madam Mayor and City Council of the City of Homer,

I am applying for the open seat on the City Council. I never had, and still do not have, political aspirations. However, the City is facing some critical issues in 2025. First, we are re-writing our Comprehensive Plan and its accompanying chapters of the Homer City Code. This work will affect developments in the City limits for years to come, which will undoubtedly influence our neighbors in surrounding areas outside the City limits. Plus, we have received reports that the City's sales taxes have declined in 2024. We have been advised we will need to "tighten our budget belts". Yet, we face deferred maintenance, understaffing, and a long wish list of capital projects in many departments. These are just two of the challenges facing the City. To successfully navigate these challenges, Homer, as a community, its Mayor and City Council will need to engage in soul searching, meaningful dialogue, and thoughtful decision-making. I'm applying because I think I can help.

I think in straight lines when facing a complicated mission. This is a product of my combined engineering and legal training, which taught me to rely on facts and measure consequences when making decisions. I am really good at researching information, connecting cause/affect relationships, and identifying sensible courses of action or policy. I love this work! It is fun, challenging, and rewarding! This is especially true when this work is done in the context of contributing to the greater good. That is why I have become, since I retired from full-time City employment early this year, an even more active community volunteer. It would be an honor and privilege to help you address the challenges and opportunities facing you.

I have been part of the PARCAC for just under a year, my first role as an appointed official. Before, I have always been part of staff; that is, on the side of the first line doers, not on the side of the policy makers. As you know, these are two very different roles. At first, it was challenging for me to navigate the transition. I have learned a lot from Staff, the City Clerk's office, and the veteran-PARCAC members about how to do this. I have also learned that no matter how strongly I might feel about an issue, I need the support of my PARCAC teammates to make meaningful progress. This experience has helped me be a more effective policy maker and advocate for PARCAC's mission. I will bring this experience to the City Council. I look forward to talking with you about how I can contribute to your team.
