1 **CITY OF HOMER** 2 **HOMER, ALASKA** 3 City Manager 4 **ORDINANCE 17-18** 5 6 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, APPROPRIATING FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND 7 8 BALANCE AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF LIMITED STAFF TIME AND 9 CITY EQUIPMENT FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION ON THE BALLOT PROPOSITION INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION INFORMATION 10 11 THAT MAY INFLUENCE THE OUTCOME OF THE ELECTION ON THE 12 PROPOSITION. 13 14 WHEREAS, Ordinance 17-10(S)(A) submits a ballot question to the voters at the October 3, 2017 regular election inquiring whether to amend the Homer Accelerated Roads and Trails 15 (HART) Program to authorize the use of revenues from the three quarters percent (34%) sales 16 tax levied to support the HART Program for the use of road and trail maintenance; and 17 18 WHEREAS, It is the Council's duty and desire to ensure that all City voters are aware of 19 the impact of amending HART to include maintenance on revenues for general government 20 purposes and the prioritization of transportation infrastructure as an essential City service; and 21 22 WHEREAS, AS 15.13.145(c)(2) permits the City to provide the public with nonpartisan 23 information about a ballot proposition, but AS 15.13.145(b) prohibits the City from using funds 24 to influence the outcome of an election concerning a ballot proposition unless the City 25 specifically appropriates the funds for that purpose by ordinance; and 26 27 WHEREAS, The Alaska Public Office Commission ("APOC"), which enforces AS 15.13.145, 28 has interpreted nonpartisan information permitted under AS 15.13.145(c)(2) very narrowly, so 29 that the City cannot inform the public fully about the effects of the ballot proposition to add 30 maintenance of local roads and trails to the eligible expenses under the HART Program without 31 including information that APOC would likely categorize as influencing the outcome of the 32 33 election on the ballot proposition. 34 35 NOW THEREFORE, The City of Homer Ordains: 36 Section 1. The FY 2017 Operating budget is hereby amended by appropriating \$5,000 37 from General Fund Balance to provide public information on the ballot proposition to amend 38

the Homer Accelerated Roads and Trails (HART) Program to authorize the use of revenues from

the 3/4% sales tax levied to support the HART Program for the use of road and trail maintenance

(ballot proposition 1), including without limitation information that may influence the

outcome of the election on the proposition, as follows:

SUBJECT: Prop 1 Public Outreach Plan

The purpose of this memo is to provide an outline of the components of the Prop 1 public information campaign, the budget for which will not exceed \$5,000. The information campaign will reach out to voters to inform them about the proposal to add road and trail maintenance as an allowable HART fund expenditure, its impact on Homer's transportation infrastructure, and the fiscal impact expanding eligible HART expenditures would have on the general fund.

Outreach components will include at a minimum:

Print media

- Postcard mailed to City of Homer residents;
- Display ads in two local newspapers;
- Informational fliers.

Radio

• 30-second informational spots aired on KBBI Public Radio and area commercial radio stations.

Digital media

- Banner display ads on local newspapers' websites;
- Feature article(s) on the City's website.
