1 **CITY OF HOMER** 2 **HOMER, ALASKA** 3 Aderhold/ 4 Cannabis Advisory Commission 5 **ORDINANCE 18-08** 6 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA, 7 8 AMENDING HOMER CITY CODE 21.28.020, PERMITTED USES AND STRUCTURES; ADDING MARLYUANA RETAIL FACILITIES IN THE 9 MARINE COMMERCIAL DISTRICT. 10 11 WHEREAS, It is in the City's lest interest to draft comprehensive regulations regarding 12 the use of property within the City to cultivate, manufacture marijuana or to operate a retail 13 14 store selling marijuana; and 15 WHEREAS, The City is dedicated to drafting regulations that prevent the distribution of 16 marijuana to minors; prevents revenue from the sale of marijuana from going to criminal 17 enterprises, gangs, and cartels; prevents the diversion of marijuana from states where it is legal 18 under state law in some form to other states; prevents state-authorized marijuana activity 19 20 from being used as a cover or pretext for the trafficking of other illegal drugs or other illegal 21 activity; prevents violence and the use of firearms in the cultivation and distribution of 22 marijuana; prevents drugged driving and the exacerbation of other adverse public health 23 consequences associated with marijuana use; prevents the growing of marijuana on public lands and the attendant public safety and environmental dangers posed by marijuana 24 25 production on public land; and prevents marijuana possession or use on federal property. 26 27 NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HOMER ORDAINS: 28 29 Section 1. Homer City Code Chapter 21.28.020 is hereby amended to read as follows: 30 31 Section 21.28.020 Permitted uses and structures. 32 33 The following uses are permitted outright in the Marine Commercial District, except when such use requires a conditional use permit by reason of size, traffic volumes, or 34 35 other reasons set forth in this chapter: 36 37 a. Offices for tourism-related charter and tour businesses, such as fishing, flightseeing, 38 day excursions and boat charters and tours: 39 40 b. Marine equipment sales, rentals, service, repair and storage; 41
