A special assessment district may be initiated by: 21 22 23 1. A resolution, initiated by a Council member, the City Manager, or through the developer reimbursement application process set forth in this title and 24 approved by a vote of not less than three-fourths of Council; or 25 26 2. A petition signed by 50 percent of the total record owners who receive notice 27 from the City Clerk's office that they will be assessed a portion of the costs of a 28 single capital improvement. 29 30 31 b. Special assessment petition applications are available from the Clerk's office. A 32 benefited property owner proposing a special assessment district by petition must file with the Clerk a complete special assessment petition application no more than 60 days 33 after the notice of assessment is issued to record owners. The Clerk shall approve all 34 35 properly and timely submitted applications within 10 days of the date on which the application is filed. The Clerk shall notify the petition sponsor in writing that the 36 petition has been approved, prepare the petition, and distribute it by certified mail to 37 38 all record owners of property in the proposed district no more than 30 days after the petition application is approved. 39

- Page 2 of 3 **ORDINANCE 20-12** CITY OF HOMER A benefitted property owner proposing a special assessment district by petition 41 must file a complete special assessment petition application with the City Clerk. 42 Special assessment petition applications are available at the City Clerk's Office. 43 Upon receipt of a completed application and Special Assessment district filing fee, 44 the City Clerk shall within 10 days: 45 1. Submit the application to the Public Works Director and Finance 46 Director for review, and 47 2. Notify the applicant in writing that the application is either sufficient or 48 insufficient and identify the insufficiencies. 49 50 Upon approval of an application the Clerk shall then prepare the petition and 51 distribute it by certified mail to all record owners of property in the proposed 52 district no more than 30 days after the petition application is approved. Petition 53 signatures of the record owners of real property in the district to be benefitted 54 must be received by the City Clerk within 60 days after the mailing of the petition. 55 56 c. Upon adoption of a resolution initiating a special assessment district, or the filing of 57 a sufficient petition with the Clerk, the City Clerk shall: 58 59 60 61 a copy of the notice in the City's regular meeting advertisement; 62 63
 - 1. Schedule a meeting of record owners of real property in the proposed district, notify the record owners by mail of the date, time and location of the meeting, and include
 - 2. Refer the proposed district to the Public Works Director, who shall prepare an improvement plan for the proposed district, to be provided at the neighborhood **meeting**. The proposed district improvement plan shall include:
 - a. The boundaries of the proposed district;
 - b. The design of the proposed improvement;
 - c. A cost estimate for the improvement;

- d. The assessment allocation method used to calculate the amount owed by each record owner in the proposed district;
- e. The percentage of the improvement cost to be assessed against properties in the district;
- f. The time period over which assessments will be financed; and
- g. Preliminary assessment roll for the proposed district.
- 3. The Public Works Director shall use the equal area method in calculating the assessment amount unless another method is specified in the improvement plan.
- Section 2: This ordinance is of a permanent and general character and shall be included in the Homer City Code.
