CITY OF HOMER 1 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 Aderhold 4 **RESOLUTION 20-025** 5 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA, 6 SUPPORTING ALASKA HOUSE BILL 198, AN ACT RELATING TO 7 AGGRAVATING FACTORS CONSIDERED AT SENTENCING 8 9 WHEREAS, The City of Homer is a diverse community, with residents who fall along the 10 full range of sexual orientation and gender identity spectrums; and 11 12 WHEREAS, A series of escalating incidents of harassment and assault in the Central 13 Kenai Peninsula, which were apparently targeted against an individual based on sexual 14 orientation, led to a town hall meeting on January 4, 2020 on the issue of public safety; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Law enforcement officials, elected officials, and over 100 Kenai Peninsula 17 residents attended the public town hall meeting to discuss hate crime generally and on the 18 Kenai Peninsula; and 19 20 WHEREAS, The incidents of harassment and assault in the Central Kenai Peninsula that 21 led to the town hall meeting on hate crimes could have happened in Homer or the surrounding 22 Southern Kenai Peninsula area; and 23 24 WHEREAS, A hate crime may be defined as a criminal offense against a person or 25 property motivated in whole or in part by an offender's bias against the victim's race, religion, 26 disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity; and 27 28 WHEREAS, At present, Alaska Statute 12.55.155(c)(22) provides as an aggravating factor 29 for sentencing for a serious crime that "the defendant knowingly directed the conduct 30 constituting the offense at a victim because of that person's race, sex, color, creed, physical or 31 mental disability, ancestry, or national origin," but does not currently include sexual 32 orientation or gender identity as an aggravating factor for sentencing of a person convicted of 33 the crime; and 34 35 36 WHEREAS, The fundamental civil and human rights of all individuals should be upheld regardless of a person's race, sex, color, creed, disability, ancestry, national origin, sexual 37 38 orientation, or gender identity; and 39 WHEREAS, Criminal offenses motivated in whole or in part by an offender's bias against 40 the victim's sexual orientation or gender identity have no place in our community; and 41

WHEREAS, After the town hall meeting, Rep. Andy Josephson introduced HB 198; and WHEREAS, Alaska House Bill 198 would amend AS 12.55.155(c)(22) to expand hate crime protections to include "sexual orientation or gender identity". NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Homer supports the expansion of hate crime protection under AS 12.55.155(c)(22) to include "sexual orientation or gender identity" as an aggravating factor for sentencing of a person convicted of a crime through Alaska House Bill 198 if the substance of HB 198 as enacted is substantially the same as pre-filed HB 198. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to Alaska Representative Sarah Vance, Alaska Representative Louise Stutes, Alaska Representative Gary Knopp, Alaska Senator Gary Stevens, and Alaska Senator Peter Micciche.
