CITY OF HOMER 1 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 City Manager 4 ORDINANCE 20-82(A) 5 AN ORDINANCE UNENCUMBERING THE UNEXPENDED AMOUNTS 6 7 FROM THE ECONOMIC RELIEF GRANT PROGRAMS AND CITY 8 MATERIAL, SERVICE, AND PERSONNEL COSTS AND MAINTAINING THOSE UNEXPENDED AMOUNTS IN THE COVID-19 RESPONSE 9 FUND FOR EFFICIENT DISTRIBUTION OF CORONAVIRUS RELIEF 10 FUNDS AS APPROVED THROUGH THE CARES ACT PROJECT 11 12 CLOSE OUT PLAN. 13 14 WHEREAS, The State of Alaska granted \$7,899,085.29 in Coronavirus Relief Funds to the City of Homer to provide direct relief for Homer's needs and expenses associated with coping 15 with the novel coronavirus, COVID-19; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, The State arranged for the \$7,899,085.29 in Coronavirus Relief Funds to be 19 disbursed in three tranches; and 20 WHEREAS, All Coronavirus Relief Funds received by the City are maintained in one 21 22 account called the COVID-19 Response Fund to which all expenses are credited against; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Only expenses that were not accounted for in the City's budget and resulting from the City's response to COVID-19 during the period of March 1, 2020 through December 30, 25 2020 are reimbursed with Coronavirus Relief Funds; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Ord. 20-25(S) and Ord. 20-45(S) encumbered \$5,600,000 of the \$7,899,085.29 28 to the City's Non-profit Economic Relief Grant program (NERG), the Social Services Economic 29 Relief Grant program (SoSERG), the Childcare Business Economic Relief Grant program 30 31 (CBERG), and the Household Economic Relief Grant program (HERG); and 32 33 WHEREAS, The SBERG, NERG, SoSERG, and CBERG programs all ended by October 2. 2020 and left the City with a remaining balance of approximately \$2,641,043.50; and 34 35 36 WHEREAS, The HERG program does not end until October 16, 2020 so a remaining 37 balance is not known at this time; and 38 WHEREAS, Ord. 20-16, Ord. 20-22, Ord. 20-25(S), Ord. 20-63, Ord. 20-45(S), and pending 39 Ord. 20-65 will have allocated \$1,644,949 to City of Homer material, services, and personnel 40 expenses to carry the City's expenses associated with COVID-19 through December 30, 2020; 41 42 and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 20-66 clarifies the allowed uses for Coronavirus Relief Funds from the Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) and added Section 4, this Ordinance allows City Council to maximize the impact of the KPB Coronavirus Relief Funds by reallocating any unexpended funds to other purposes allowed under the KPB Grant Agreement through the CARES Act Project Closeout Plan; and

WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the City to have the ability to respond and address community and municipal needs as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic quickly since CARES Act dollars must be spent by December 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Legislation appropriating specific Coronavirus Relief Fund amounts to programs with CARES Act dollars prevents the City from using the unexpended balances of these programs to efficiently cover other prioritized needs of the City unless additional legislation un-appropriating and re-appropriating the funds takes place; and

WHEREAS, After the October 12, 2020 City Council meeting there are three scheduled City Council meetings left in the year to address appropriation needs, unless Council schedules additional hearings; and

WHEREAS, City Council prioritized eligible uses of the remaining balance of City of Homer CARES Act funds in the CARES Act Project Close Out Plan; and

WHEREAS, The CARES Act Project Close Out Plan provides staff direction on incurring expenses associated with community and city needs related to the COVID-19 pandemic response.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HOMER ORDAINS:

Section 1. The unexpended amounts of the City of Homer Economic Relief Grant Programs will be unencumbered and kept ready for additional COVID-19 related expenses as approved through the CARES Act Project Close Out Plan and incurred by the City.

<u>Section 2.</u> Any remaining City material, service, or personnel costs identified by the City Manager as unexpended will be unencumbered and be kept ready for additional COVID-19 related expenses as approved through the CARES Act Project Close Out Plan and incurred by the City.

Section 3. This Ordinance allows City Council to maximize the impact of Coronavirus Relief Funds in response to community and municipal needs before the December 30, 2020 deadline.

Section 4. Staff will provide Council with regular reports detailing costs incurred 84 through the CARES Act Project Close Out Plan so that City Council can adjust the Plan as 85 needed to respond to COVID-19. Costs incurred will then be applied to the COVID-19 Response 86 Fund. 87 88 Section 5.
