 - For persons who have served one three-year term during their continuous period of service, the longest term served of less than three years shall constitute a full term, and other periods of service of less than three years shall not be considered full terms.
 - 2. For persons who have served no three-year terms during their continuous period of service, then the two longest terms served shall both constitute full terms, and other periods of service of less than three years shall not be considered full terms.
 - bd. The Mayor shall be elected for a two-year term and until a successor qualifies. The term of office of the Mayor is 2 years. No person who has completed two consecutive full terms as Mayor may serve another term or portion of a term until a period of two years has passed since the end of their second consecutive full term of office. A full term of office means the regular term of office for Mayor and does not include portions of a term served by appointment or election to the remainder of an unexpired term vacated by another person.
