CITY OF HOMER 1 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 City Manager **RESOLUTION 22-007** 4 5 6 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA, 7 ADOPTING AN ALTERNATIVE ALLOCATION METHOD FOR THE 8 FY2022 SHARED FISHERIES BUSINESS TAX PROGRAM AND 9 CERTIFYING THAT THIS ALLOCATION METHOD FAIRLY REPRESENTS THE DISTRIBUTION OF SIGNIFICANT EFFECTS OF 10 FISHERIES BUSINESS ACTIVITY IN THE COOK INLET FISHERIES 11 12 MANAGEMENT AREA. 13 WHEREAS, Alaska Statute 29.60.450 requires that for a municipality to participate in the 14 FY 22 Shared Fisheries Business Tax Program, the municipality must demonstrate to the 15 Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development that the municipality 16 suffered significant effects during calendar year 2020 from fisheries business activities: and, 17 18 WHEREAS, Title 3 Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) 134.060 provides for the allocation 19 of available program funding to eligible municipalities located within fisheries management 20 21 areas specified by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, Title 3 AAC 134.070 provides for the use, at the discretion of the Department 24 of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, of alternative allocation methods 25 which may be used within fisheries management areas if all eligible municipalities within the 26 area agree to use the method, and the method incorporates some measure of the relative 27 significant effect of fisheries business activity on the respective municipalities in the area; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, The Homer City Council proposes to use an alternative allocation method for allocation of FY 2022 funding available within the Cook Inlet Fisheries Management Area in 31 agreement with all other municipalities in this area participating in the FY 2022 Shared 32 33 Fisheries Business Tax Program. 34 35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: City Council of Homer, Alaska, by this 36 Resolution certifies that the following alternative allocation method fairly represents the 37 distribution of significant effects during 2020 of fisheries business activity in the Cook Inlet Fisheries Management Area: 38 39
