CITY OF HOMER 1 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 Aderhold/Erickson **RESOLUTION 23-118** 4 5 6 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA, DIRECTING THE CITY ADMINISTRATION TO INVESTIGATE 7 8 POTENTIAL LOCATIONS AND RELATED COSTS FOR A FUTURE CITY 9 OF HOMER MULTI USE COMMUNITY RECREATION CENTER FOR CITY COUNCIL REVIEW. 10 11 12 WHEREAS, The City of Homer Community Recreation division offers year round, affordable indoor and outdoor programs at the Homer Education and Recreation Complex 13 (HERC); and 14 15 WHEREAS, The Multi-Use Community Recreation Center project is the number two 16 project on the City's 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Plan and continues to be a high priority 17 for the community residents, city council and mayor; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, The HERC campus is a highly desirable location for indoor and outdoor recreation; and 21 22 WHEREAS, The recent hazardous materials (hazmat) study has determined the option 23 to tear down or upgrade the existing HERC facilities at the HERC campus is currently 24 25 impractical; and 26 WHEREAS, The City's ability to address the hazmat issues are subject to the availability 27 of federal grants that will likely take years to secure and are not guaranteed; and 28 29 WHEREAS, In light of the hazmat issues, the City of Homer needs to pursue alternate 30 location options to move the Multi-Use Community Recreation Center project ahead in a timely 31 manner; and 32 33 WHEREAS, The proposed facility size and design should have at least two basketball 34 regulation sized gymnasiums that will accommodate multiple volleyball and six pickleball 35 courts in addition to activity rooms to host instructional classes such as dance, karate, and 36 yoga; and 37 38 WHEREAS, The City has limited funds for a new Multipurpose Recreation Center and a 39 conceptual budget of not more than \$10,000,000 or \$12,000,000 for building, parking lot and 40 site amenities is set as a project guideline for the purpose of site selection (based on the 41 amount of revenue that could be generated from a bond). 42

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Homer, Alaska hereby 45 directs Administration to: 46 47 1. Investigate possible land locations and existing facilities options including privately 48 owned and city owned land; 49 50 51 2. Establish and define criteria for Administration to select at least three potential options that would include (at a minimum): acreage, location, opportunity for future facility 52 expansion, proximity to existing infrastructure (water, sewer, sidewalks), and cost; 53 54 3. Develop a matrix that assesses the possible sites against the criteria and determine 55 the top three potential sites based on the outcome of the assessment; 56 57 58 4. Initiate conversations with property owners of the top three sites; 59 5. Pursue site analysis for the top three sites with possible efforts from volunteer 60 61 professionals; 62 6. Identify a funding strategy for new site purchase if a non-city site is one of the top 63 three options; 64 65 66 7. Include the Parks, Art, Recreation, and Culture Advisory Commission in evaluation of 67 the top three sites and possible purchasing strategies of any non-city properties; and 68 8. Provide for public comment on the three selected sites and possible purchasing 69 strategies. 70 71 9.
