18	loan agreement (No. 409341) totaling \$287,692 for 20 years; and		
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20	WHEREAS, Resolution 23-108 certified the final assessment roll for the Tasmania Court		
21	Sewer Special Assessment District (SAD); and		
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23	WHEREAS, The City submitted a disbursement request to ADEC and those funds have		
24	been received.

CITY OF HOMER 1 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 City Manager/ Public Works Director 4 RESOLUTION 21-045(A) 5 6 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA 7 ACKNOWLEDGING THE SUFFICIENCY OF THE TASMANIA COURT 8 SEWER IMPROVEMENT SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT, 9 APPROVING THE IMPROVEMENT PLAN, ESTIMATED COST OF 10 **IMPROVEMENT** AND ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY. 11 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR A LOAN FROM 12 THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION 13 CLEAN WATER FUND TO FINANCE THE PROJECT, AND 14 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A SOLE-15 SOURCE CONTRACT WITH BISHOP ENGINEERING FOR THE 16 DESIGN OF THE SEWER PROJECT. 17 18 WHEREAS, A petition was initiated by Homer City Council within Tasmania Court to 19 form a sewer improvement special assessment district (SAD) by Resolution 21-091(A); and 20 21 WHEREAS, Pursuant to HCC 17.02.050 (b) if owners of real property that would bear 50 22 percent or more of the assessed cost of the improvement file timely written objections, the 23 Council may not proceed with the improvement unless it revises the improvement plan to 24 reduce the assessed cost to less than 50% of the assessed cost of the improvement; and 25 26 WHEREAS, The Tasmania Court Sewer SAD is made up of the same boundary as the 27 Tasmania Court Water SAD that was approved by Resolution 20-083; and 28 29 WHEREAS, The estimated cost of the sewer improvements is \$287,692 with property 30 owners paying 75% (\$215,769) and the Homer Accelerated Water and Sewer Program (HAWSP) 31 32 paying 25% (\$71,923) of the costs; 33 WHEREAS, The deadline to receive written objections was May 23, 2021 and five written 34 objection(s) were received, which equaled more than 50% of the property owners in the 35 36 district; and 37 WHEREAS. The value of the proposed assessments related to these objecting property 38 owners estimated was \$98,075 (5 times \$19,615), which is 34% of the estimated cost of the 39 sewer project; and 40 41

WHEREAS, A Public Hearing was held on May 24, 2021; and

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 WHEREAS, Council postponed action on May 24th at the request of Public Works in Memorandum 21-085 to allow time for a neighborhood meeting to inform property owners of an Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation Principal Forgiveness subsidy that creates a savings in the Tasmania Court Water SAD thereby reducing the overall cost to property owners for water and sewer improvements; and

WHEREAS, A neighborhood meeting was held on June 3rd and property owners were advised they have until June 13th to consider the new information and provide written withdrawal of their objections; and

WHEREAS, As of June 7, 2021, three property owners have withdrawn their objections, reducing the objections to properties representing 14% of the proposed costs; and

WHEREAS, Council finds the petition bears sufficient support and that the water sewer improvement is necessary and to the benefit the following eleven properties that shall be included in the Tasmania Court Sewer Improvement Special Assessment District:

1 CITY OF HOMER 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 City Clerk **RESOLUTION 23-108** 5 6 A RESOLUTION OF THE HOMER CITY COUNCIL CONFIRMING THE 7 ASSESSMENT ROLL, ESTABLISHING DATES FOR PAYMENT OF 8 SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND ESTABLISHING DELINQUENCY, 9 PENALTY, AND INTEREST PROVISIONS FOR THE TASMANIA 10 COURT WATER AND SEWER **IMPROVEMENT SPECIAL** 11 ASSESSMENT DISTRICT 12 WHEREAS, In compliance with Homer City Code Chapter 17, Improvement Districts, the 13 Homer City Council created the Tasmania Court Water Assessment Roll on September 28, 2020 14 15 with Resolution 20-083 and the Tasmania Court Sewer Special Assessment District on June 14, 16 2021 with Resolution 21-045(A); and 17 18 WHEREAS, The Notice of Public Hearing and Notice of Right to Object dated August 21. 19 2023 was mailed to property owners in the district advising that written objections must be filed with the City Clerk no later than September 11, 2023; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, A second Notice of Public Hearing and Right to Object dated September 12. 23 2023 was mailed to property owners advising a page was omitted from the original notice and 24 that written objections must be filed with the City Clerk no later than September 25, 2023; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Public Hearings were held on September 11 and 25, 2023 to hear objections to the final assessment roll; and 27 28 WHEREAS, One objection was filed on September 7, 2023 by Bryan and Ginny Evans; 29 30 and 31 32 WHEREAS, The final assessment roll as presented by the City Clerk is attached hereto as Attachment A, is hereby confirmed as the official assessment roll for the Tasmania Court 33 34 Water and Sewer Special Assessment Districts and the Mayor and Clerk shall be directed to sign 35 same. 36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that on or before 5:00 p.m. on February 1, 2024 all 37 assessments in the Tasmania Court Water and Sewer Special Assessment District shall become 38 39 due and payable in full. All assessments not paid in full by this date shall be considered

delinquent and in default and shall have added a penalty the rate of ten and one half percent (10.5%) per annum until paid. Should default occur, the City of Homer will institute a civil

action for a foreclosure of the assessment lien. Foreclosure shall be against all property on

which assessments are in default. All costs including collection and legal fees resulting from

such action, shall be added and incorporated into the assessed amount due plus interest and

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77 78 penalties and shall be reimbursed from the proceeds of foreclosure sale of the assessed real property.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an optional twenty (20) year payment plan for the water and sewer assessments is offered whereby the assessments may be paid in equal yearly installments plus interest of one and one half percent (1.5%) per annum on the unpaid balance of the assessment. The first such installment shall be due and payable without interest on or before 5:00 p.m. February 1, 2024 and each installment thereafter shall be due on or before February 1 of each year, plus interest on the unpaid balance of the assessment. If any annual installment payment is not received when due, the entire outstanding principle amount of the assessment shall be in default and shall be immediately due and payable. The entire outstanding assessment principle (including the annual installment) shall have added a penalty of ten and one half percent (10.5%) on the outstanding principle. The principle shall draw an additional interest at the rate of ten and one half percent (10.5%) per annum until paid. Should default occur, the City will institute civil action for foreclosure of the assessment lien. Foreclosure shall be against all property on which assessments are in default. All costs including collection and legal fees resulting from such action shall be added and incorporated into the assessed amount due plus interest and penalties, and shall be reimbursed from the proceeds of foreclosure sale of the assessed real property.
