1 CITY OF HOMER 2 HOMER, ALASKA 3 Aderhold/Lord 4 **RESOLUTION 24-015** 5 6 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA 7 REQUESTING THE STATE OF ALASKA MAKE A MEANINGFUL AND 8 TIMELY INCREASE TO THE BASE STUDENT ALLOCATION FOR 9 PUBLIC SCHOOLS. 10 11 WHEREAS, The State of Alaska is constitutionally obligated to establish and maintain a 12 system of public schools; and 13 14 WHEREAS, The City of Homer is within the Kenai Peninsula Borough, which is required by AS 29.35.160 to constitute a borough school district and establish, maintain, and operate a 15 16 system of public schools on an areawide basis; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Paul Banks and West Homer Elementary, Homer Middle, Homer High, Homer 19 Flex and Fireweed Academy Schools are Kenai Peninsula Borough School District public 20 schools within Homer's city limits; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Maintaining high quality public schools is important to the quality of life of 23 the Homer residents and competitiveness to attract a strong workforce; and 24 25 WHEREAS, AS 14.17.470 currently states that the base student allocation provided by 26 the State is \$5,960; and 27 28 WHEREAS, The State is currently providing about 56% of 4 Kenai Peninsula Borough 29 School District education funding and local Kenai Peninsula Borough contributions make up 30 the majority of the outstanding balance; and 31 32 WHEREAS, Education is the single largest budgetary item for the Kenai Peninsula 33 Borough; and 34 35 WHEREAS, without a BSA increase or one-time funding, the Kenai Peninsula Borough 36 School District will again be facing a budget deficit of over \$13 million for FY25 which will most likely require an increase to class size and the elimination of programs important to our 37 38 students and community members; and 39 40 WHEREAS, our school district has made significant cuts to administration and the 41 central office over the past several years and we no longer have cuts to propose that won't

impact large numbers of students and community members; and

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WHEREAS, In addition to quality educational programs, the current state funding levels for Alaska's schools leave programs like our pools, theaters, athletics, and extracurricular activities in serious risk of cuts as the School Board works to protect the instructional mandate of the School District with insufficient funding; and

WHEREAS, a stagnant BSA amount coupled with a constant upward inflationary trend

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has eroded away the effectiveness of the formulated Basic Need amount; and

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WHEREAS, The Kenai Peninsula Borough has continually increased local contributions to keep pace with these rising costs and has reached the maximum allowable amount resulting in a need to decrease school district spending on programs essential to our students' growth for this upcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the dollar amount of the BSA directly affects not only how much the State will fund the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District, but also how much the Kenai Peninsula Borough is allowed to contribute to schools; and

WHEREAS, The State has not made meaningful base student allocation increases since fiscal years 2015 through 2017 totaling an additional amount per student of \$250; and

WHEREAS, the State has given much appreciated one-time funding to Alaska's schools for the past several years; and

WHEREAS, these one-time funds do truly help relieve budget deficits for a current year, however they in no way contribute to a permanent solution, effectively "kicking the can down the road" to be discussed again each year; and

WHEREAS, On February 28, 2023, the Legislative Finance Division Director stated to the House Finance Committee that "today, the base student allocation is the lowest it's been in the last 20 years - adjusted for inflation"; and

WHEREAS, the FY12 value of the BSA in today's dollars would be approximately \$1,200 more than Alaska school districts are currently receiving; and

WHEREAS, an inflationary increase matching this amount would ensure Alaska school districts could continue current educational programs with no anticipated cuts; and

WHEREAS, last year Alaska State Senate and House members proposed bills to begin addressing this inflationary deficit with increases to the BSA; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska State Senate forwarded a bill to the House of Representatives increasing the BSA to \$6,640 per student; and

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 WHEREAS, the Alaska State House will now have the opportunity to consider this BSA increase as well; and

WHEREAS, if passed by the legislature, Governor Dunleavy will be in the position to accept or veto the proposed increases to the base student allocation; and

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly adopted Resolution 2024-002 on January 2, 2024, requesting the State of Alaska make a meaningful increase to the base student allocation for public schools and include an annual inflationary adjustment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Homer, Alaska, requests that the State Legislature pass a meaningful increase to the base student allocation in a timely manner to permanently reduce the fiscal gap created in the Alaska educational system due to a lack of inflationary increases to the BSA over the last several years. Additionally, that the BSA be adjusted every year in an amount equivalent to the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Alaska (CPI) for the December ending previous to the fiscal funding year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council of Homer, Alaska petitions Governor Dunleavy to implement a permanent increase to the base student allocation, to include an annual inflationary adjustment, as brought forth by the Alaska Legislature with no vetoes exercised that would reduce or eliminate the State budget funds needed to successfully make the increase a reality. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to Governor Dunleavy, the Kenai Peninsula legislative delegation, the President of the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District Board of Education, the Education Committees of the Alaska House and Alaska Senate, and other interested parties.
