RESOLUTION 12-018

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA, AMENDING THE CITY OF HOMER FEE SCHEDULE TO PROVIDE THAT A MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL ACCOUNT CUSTOMER IS CHARGED ONLY A SINGLE MONTHLY SEWER AND WATER CUSTOMER CHARGE.

WHEREAS, Resolution 11-094 was introduced at the October 10, 2011 meeting of the Homer City Council; and

WHEREAS, Noticed public hearings were held for Resolution 11-094 at the October 10, 2011, November 28, 2011, and December 12, 2011 meetings of the Homer City Council; and

WHEREAS, At the December 12, 2011 meeting of the Homer City Council, Resolution 11-094(S) was substituted for Resolution 11-094, without notifying the public of the changes in the resolution which had significant impacts on a large class of citizens; and

WHEREAS, In order for local Government to maintain the trust and respect of its citizens, the spirit of the public notice process must be strictly observed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Homer, Alaska, that the City of Homer Fee Schedule is amended as follows:

SEWER FEES:

Sewer Connection and Extension Permit Fee

Single Family/Duplex \$255

Multi-Family/Commercial/Industrial \$330

Sewer Rate Schedule.

All sewer utility services shall be billed according to the following schedule. This schedule is for monthly sewer services and is in addition to any charges for connecting or disconnecting the service, installation of the service or any assessment of the improvements.

44 **Single Family Residential** - A unit providing housing for one household; with less than  
45 **25% of the building area used for business or commercial purposes.**

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47 **Multi-Family Residential** - A building or lot occupied by more than one household:  
48 **contained within one building or several building within one complex. Examples of multi-**  
49 **family units include duplexes, four-plexes and up, apartments, condominiums, co-**  
50 **housing projects, and multiple structures on one lot (where units are normally rented or**  
51 **occupied for longer than one month at a time). Examples of units not considered as**  
52 **multi-family include hotels, motels, B&B's seasonal rooms/cabins (where units are**

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55 **Commercial** - Any user not defined as Residential.

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57 Sewer System Residential or Residential Equivalent Dischargers Who Are Not Water System  
58 Users:

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60 Sewer system dischargers who are not water system users shall be charged at the rate of  
61 \$54.90. Variable rate \$34.90 based on 3,500 gallons per month plus monthly customer charge  
62 \$20. The City reserves the right to adjust this rate based on the characteristics of the service  
63 for non-residential or non-residential equivalent users. Customers who receive septic service  
64 shall be charged an additional \$6.00\* per month.

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66 Sewer System Dischargers Who Are Members of Kachemak City LID:

67 Kachemak City Local Improvement District (LID) members have contributed to the initial cost  
68 of the sewer treatment plant and the collection system. Kachemak City LID dischargers  
69 connected within the LID and the City of Homer shall bill Kachemak City in one lump sum at  
70 the rate of \$60.90. Variable rate \$34.90 based on 3,500 gallons per month plus monthly  
71 customer charge of \$20 plus septage cost \$6.00\* per month for each residential or residential  
72 equivalent discharger. Kachemak City shall be responsible for payment to the City of Homer.

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74 Domestic sewer service customers who use large quantities of City water in addition to their  
75 domestic use shall be allowed, with the Public Works Director's approval, to install an  
76 additional water meter on the domestic water use line for the purpose of metering and charging  
77 for domestic sewer system use. Sewer system use will be billed monthly.

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79 The City will allow, upon approval by Public Works and a permit from the Public Works  
80 Department, a second water usage meter - called a seasonal sewer meter - for each customer  
81 that desires to measure the flow of City water that is not discharged to the sewer system during  
82 the summer growing season, June 15 through September 15. Rates noted above do not apply.

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84 Seasonal Sewer Meter Fee is \$211.97.

Examples of units not considered as multi-family include hotels, motels, B&B's seasonal rooms/cabins (where units are routinely rented or occupied for less than one month at a time.)

**Commercial** - Any user not defined as Residential.
