ORDINANCE 25-52

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HOMER, ALASKA AMENDING HCC 9.16.010 TO PROVIDE FOR AN INCREASE OF 0.3% SALES TAX, FOR A TERM OF EIGHT YEARS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION QEARMULTI-PURPOSE COMMUNITY RECREATION FACILITY, AND DEFINITION OF SUCH SALES TAX INCREASE TO THE QUALIFIC VOTERS OF THE CITY AT THE REGULAR ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY ON OCTOBER 7, 2025.

WHEREAS, the City of Homer, Alaska ("City / is a first class city and and existing under the Constitution and laws of the State of x ska and day exercise a legislative power not prohibited by law and the City has determined a structurers set forth in this ordinance are not prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, Under the provision of AS 29.45.700(b) AS 29.45.670, the City may increase the rate of its sales tax only after an ordinance authorizing the increase is approved by a majority of those voting on the question of a regular of special election; and

WHEREAS, On June 26, 2018, a voters a porized an increase in the City sales tax in the amount of 0.3% the lice Station Stars Tax") for purposes of paying debt service on its General Obligation Folice Station Bond, λ 9 Series A ("Police Station Bond"), proceeds of which financed the act disition and extraction of a new police station; and

HEREAS, the Police Station Sales Tax expires on December 31 of the calendar year in which the Police Station Book is paid in full; and

When AS, The City anticipates it will have sufficient funds to pay all principal of and interest due to the Police Station Bond in 2026 thereby resulting in the termination of the Police Station Sa. Tax on December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, A need for a new multi-purpose recreational facility ("Project") has been determined; reports relating to the existing Homer Education and Recreational Center (HERC 1 and HERC 2) have revealed that both buildings contain hazardous material, as expected due to their age and prevailing construction materials utilized in the 1950s; and

WHEREAS, the Project, when completed, is intended to provide residents with space for

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the Project will promote the public

WHEREAS, The City Council views the acquisition and construction of the Project as necessary and beneficial to the community, and determines that the City should begin accumulating funds to finance Project costs; and

WHEREAS, To assist in financing costs of the Project, use funds generate from a 0.3% sales tax ("Project Sales Tax") will be dedicated to prement of priect costs and has been determined to be in the best interest of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Project Sales Tax would collected for a term of eight (8) years commencing on January 1, immediately following contains on the Police Station Tax on December 31, and terminating on December 31st of the 15th year; and

WHEREAS, Submitting the aforcementioned question when voters at the next general election will ensure that construction of a Project is supported by the majority of voters.

b. An a stional consumer's sales tax in the amount of three-quarters of one percent is hereby levied by a City of Homer on all sales, rents and services within the City except as the same may be otherwise exempted by law, for the purpose of funding debt retirement of the sewer treatment plant improvements, and, to the extent revenues from such tax exceed such debt retirement obligations, for the purpose of funding water and sewer systems.

c. An additional consumer's sales tax in the amount of three-quarters of one percent is hereby levied by the City of Homer on all sales, rents and services within the City except as the same may be otherwise exempted by law, for the purpose of funding street reconstruction

improvements and related utilities, construction of new local roads, construction of new local trails, and maintenance of local roads and trails.

d. An additional consumer's sales tax in the amount of thirty-five hundredths of one percent is hereby levied by the City of Homer on all sales, rents and services within the City, except as the same may be otherwise exempted by law, for the purpose of funding public safety operations and infrastructure within the City, including without limitation construction of a police station, with three-tenths of one percent of the sales tax rate providing funds to pay debt service on general obligation bonds authorized by Ord. 18-26/AMOVA) and expiring on December 31st of the year when the City has received sufficient ands from the sales tax rate to pay all of that service.

e. An additional consumer's sales tax in the amount of three-traiths of one percent is hereby levied by the City of Homer or at sales, rents and services within the City, except as the same may be otherwise excepted by law, for the construction of a multi-put use regulational facility within the City, commencing on January 1 of the year following arrantion of the three-tenths of one percent of the sales tax used to pay debt service on a reral obligation bonds authorized by Ord. 18-26(A)(S)(A) and described in Section 9.1. 10% above, and expiring on December 31st of the eighth year of election of such tax.

f. The funds and fundactivities subsections (a) through (d) (e) of this section shall be separately accounted, and sere shall any sterly reports to the Homer City Council reflecting each fund's inflows and stellows, marked against their respective budgetary histories and project of the council reflections.
